

REPORT ON TEACHERS' SATISFACTION SURVEY

The performance of an institution may often be judged by its resources. When the performance of any academic institution is to be addressed, the primary resource is the knowledge and the sources of this knowledge. The teachers are an impetus to channelize this knowledge. Their guidance can indeed show a transition in learning pace of students. A teachers' satisfaction survey has been conducted and the following results have been reported.

Primarily, all the teaching staff unanimously agree with the vision and the mission of the institution. They together insist that the mission and vision of College is the right path for upliftment of the students and the society. In the backdrop of all the College engagements with the society around and industry, it has been observed that a proportion of 93.10% respondents have found that SLC resources have been satisfactory to engage with society and industry.

The institution has been serving its students as per the emerging needs of their academic endeavours and also promoting them for extra-curricular activities. The College teams have bagged numerous awards ranging from Inter-College competitions to Inter-state competitions, from sports to start-up ideas. The team SLC has an adequate infrastructure to provide students with an enriching experience of College of life. The College is of the view that the out-of-class contact is crucial with undergraduate students. Further, the efficiency of knowledge at this level can merely be concluded on the best combination of Teaching and Research. Here, the 97.2% and 63.9% of academic staff tends to believe that a conducive environment is available for Teaching and Research respectively.

The 76.4% of the teachers have reported a satisfactory level of Corporate life of the College. As far as class room engagements are concerned, a major segment of this response group chases Traditional Methods, ICT, Interactive Method, Classroom Innovations and Experimental learning. The students are future of the nation. So, the educational qualification should also be complemented by continuous mentoring. All the respondents with no exception have agreed to the concept of mentoring. The ethical standards amongst of the students is a concern for the institution. Besides, an affirmative experience of ethical standards has been observed among the students.
