
3. Lamp Lightning

All lamps (Diyas) were made up from biodegradable material keeping Yamuna River safe from pollution and organic waste. More than 50 handmade candles (Eco-friendly) and lamps (Diyas) were flown into the Yamuna River









4. Yamuna Aarti

At 7:00 p.m. all volunteers of NSS participate in Yamuna Aarti. Around 50 persons were there in Yamuna Aarti including local residents. 4 special priests were invited for this invent. At the end of Yamuna Aarti, all flow their lamp (Diya) into the Yamuna River with flowers. The day 1 of Yamuna Mahotsav ends with distribution of Prasad.
