Shyam Lal College being one of the oldest colleges of East Delhi is dedicated to the educational needs of its surrounding social communities. While the college has come a long way in terms of institutional building and core growth, it has continued to adhere to the original principles of inclusive, innovative and skill based education that contributes to enriching the lives of the student fraternity.

In the rapidly evolving educational scenario, our vision remains to strive for meaningful transformation of students from learners to responsible citizens and our mission is to guide them with care and support, by creating an environment for engagement in academics, sports, extracurricular activities, and instilling strong values to prepare them as future leaders in their respective fields. Through the modes of inclusive education and academic excellence, we hope to build committed and creative professionals who can continue to aspire for newer horizons.

Our approach is to encourage gender sensitivity and diversity by providing equal opportunity and accessibility to all our students and stakeholders. At SLC, we believe in imparting comprehensive knowledge, supported by critical and analytical thinking which can greatly contribute towards creating a society free from any social bias or discrimination. Both academic and administrative management processes of the college work collaboratively to assess and assemble the detailed achievements of the college which is reflected in the evaluative sections of the report. Since the submission of the report up till now, the entire process has presented us with an objective view of the standard and growth of SLC as an institution. We've taken this as an opportunity to not only polish our qualitative skills but also work on our drawbacks, scrutinise our weaknesses and set out future goals. At SLC, we have always emphasised on the importance of the demands of time and move towards a positive direction by setting attainable goals.

At SLC, through the dedicated efforts of teachers and efficient management, we have been able to keep up with updated pedagogical means and innovative teaching practices. Several departments have made use of the ICT support provided by the college to conduct seminars and virtual lectures by eminent scholars from national and international universities. **The IQAC has been a leading force within the**

college encouraging practices of e-learning as well as contributing and accessing e-resources. It has successfully hosted workshops on MOOCS, E- Learning and Smart Office Administration, conducted by experts from the University, for teaching and non-teaching staff.

The classroom no longer remains an insulated space but is increasingly connected to other advanced spheres of professional excellence. Another significant step in this direction has been the initiatives and collaborations taken by the various special centres. We keenly look forward to more such collaborations in the future with both International as well as National institutions. While industrial interaction trips were a key area that the college focussed on, students have also been taken on important field visits to the Parliament under their courses in coordination with the special study centres – the Gandhi Study Circle and the Ambedkar Study Circle.

The college has several dynamic extracurricular societies which contribute to the creativity and cultural enhancement of the college. **The students have won awards in quite a few inter college and national events, especially in dramatics and the E-Cell. Our unique initiative, combining creative talent, organizational skills and professionalism, the University Chef Competition** saw participation from students of other colleges and universities and was concluded with much fanfare and media attention.

The final round which was judged by nationally renowned chef, Nita Mehta, was an innovative blend of talent and skill, which encouraged students to transform their natural inclinations to professional achievements.

An area where SLC has continued to excel is in the realm of sports. **Our sports ground is open not only for students of the college but also encourages local talent from senior secondary schools in the neighbourhood. 1. Research/Consultancy/Collaboration

1.1 CIMO

Continuing with taking the brand SLC to newer heights, the College, under the dynamic Headship of Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, successfully arranged the academic exchange programme between Shyam Lal College and **three universities from Finland - Turku School of Economics/Pori Unit (University of Turku), South Eastern Finland University of Applied Sciences (XAMK), Turku University of Applied Sciences (Coordinator), Finland** based on the project **Responsible Business Professional For Finland and India Trade** (1st September 2016 – 31st August 2018) funded by The Center for International Mobility (CIMO), Finland. **It a matter of pride that CIMO has also sponsored to take around 4 of our students to Finland for a month in the duration of the programme.**

The Responsible Business Professionals for Finland and India Trade Project aims to develop responsible business knowledge and proactive management competences for the growing bilateral trade between Finland and India.

The Finnish government's target is to increase bilateral trade between Finland and India as well as responsible business practices in Finland and in other countries. The economy of India is an untapped opportunity in the Finnish business even though its economy has fastest growing economy of the BRICS' countries. (e.g. Finland-India Business Guide 2016, 10). It will have lot of scope for synergistic benefits.

The Educational Need of the Project:

Responsible Business Professionals for Finland and India trade project aims to co-develop and create proactive business experts both for Finland and for India in the context of Finnish-India trade. The project also aims to deepen co-operation between India and Finnish Higher Education Institutions in order to create spillover impact for the local and global business. The project will also explore the contextual best managerial practices and strategies of BRICS countries (India) which may be appropriate for replication in Finland.

The Cognitive Need of the Project:

Responsible Business Professionals for Finland and India trade project aims to deepen the understanding of responsible business opportunities and challenges between Finland and India and on the other hand the project aims for developing the understanding of sustainable growth within the parameters of institutions.

Fine-tuning of the project plan was conducted on 8th – 14th December during the planning workshop, held at Turku Finland, in which Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal SLC represented the college. Based on the discussions the approximate number of exchanges and target institutions of exchanges between institutions were planned. In this first installment of the project, Dr. Kar extensively discussed the schedule and planning module of the project which would involve:

- Conduct value addition in the form of special lectures in areas of expertise mentioned for students and teachers
- Conduct workshops in the designated areas
- Develop modules in the identified areas for the benefit of the target audience
- Jointly publish books/anthologies in specific project areas
- Provide collaborative support in developing state of the art literature in the designated areas
- Organize and support conferences/workshops/symposiums as part of the project deliverables in collaboration with Indian industry and Govt. agencies.
- Likely to act as a visiting professor in the designated areas of expertise as required under the project

The planning workshop concluded with a detailed presentation about SLC by the project partner Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar.

The second part of the Exchange Programme is being conducted at Shyam Lal College from 20th March 2017 to 18th April 2017. The project schedule at SLC includes a series of special lectures, workshops, faculty and student interactions, seminars, interviews, presentations among others. Under the aegis of Department of Commerce & Department of English, SLC invited **Prof. Ari Lindeman and Mr. Minh Tram, student visiting SLC from South Eastern Finland University of Applied Sciences to our college from 20th March to 18th April 2017 under CIMO project.** Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal SLC gave a presentation about the College and also introduced the Exchange Programme for the members of the audience. During the course of his visit, **Prof. Lindeman would address the faculty and students at SLC and other colleges in Delhi University on topics relating to Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Client-Centred Business Communication, Responsible Leadership and many more.** For the first interaction a Seminar on "Entrepreneurship and Innovation" was organized on 20th March, 2017. The session began with the conventional Lamp Lighting Ceremony by Prof. Ari Lindeman, Prof. C.K. Jaggi, member of Governing Body, SLC, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, Principal, SLC, Dr. S.B. Rathore, TIC, Commerce, Dr. Kusha Tiwari, TIC, English, Dr. Kavita Arora, Convenor, Commerce Association

and Dr. Usha Kashyap, Senior Faculty, Commerce Department. The seminar was attended by students and faculty members. Prof. Ari Lindeman delivered a lecture on "Not Innovation Alone". He talked about the need to impart innovation by a student centered approach. He also recommended for Entrepreneurial competencies to be imparted in the academic institutions for students' betterment. The session was followed by interaction with the students after which Prof. Lindeman and Mr. Minh Tram visited various facilities of the college and participated in various student centric and cultural activities.

CIISD and E-cell of SLC organized a student interaction with Prof. Ari Lindeman on 21st March, 2017. SLC's Centre for Industry Interaction and Skill Development organised an interaction session with Prof. Ari Lindeman from Turku School of Economics, University of Turku, Finland on March 21, 2017. The interaction covered an array of subjects ranging from education system in Finland, attitudes towards entrepreneurship and innovation in that country, traits required to succeed as entrepreneurs, etc. Faculty including members of all three societies viz. Skill Development Cell, Entrepreneurship Cell and Placement Cell were part of this interactive session. Prof. Lindeman shared their lifetime experiences with students and told that practical knowledge is as important and necessary as theory. Students were very keen to know about the environment of Finland and education system there. At the end of the talk, the speaker revealed that he has been addressing several such seminars over the years, but was delighted with the professional environment he was provided by the college. The speaker also added that the warmth received was far unmatched

On 22nd March Prof. Ari Lindeman had an interactive workshop with SLC faculty on pedagogical tools and methods used by them in their classroom teaching. Prof. Lindeman talked about the higher education system and the teaching-learning environment in Finland. He also engaged the SLC faculty in some brain storming exercises that required them to come up with points relating to teaching objectives, challenges that they face and possible solutions to these challenges. The faculty members also showed interest in knowing about the university setup in Finland and the extent of government support to the education sector in Finland. The workshop session ended with a fruitful mutual discussion. **Prof Lindman has also made presentations about the project to elicit engaged responses from Cluster Innovation Centre, University of Delhi, Zakir Hussain College and Ambedkar College of University of Delhi.**

The program team led by Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar has also made a detailed programme schedule for Mr. Minh Tram, student visiting SLC under the exchange programme. He would be conducting interviews with some business people, lecturers, and students in India, during the duration of his stay, to understand how they understand "responsibility in

business". The team has also arranged for him to attend few relevant and available courses at SLC, University of Delhi relating to management and communication. He would also be representing the South-Eastern Finland University of Applied Sciences during the mobility and give short presentations about South-Eastern Finland University of Applied Sciences to SLC faculty and students.

Both Prof. Lindeman and Mr. Minh Tram, during the course of their visit, would be visiting other institutions and corporate houses for research, interaction and data accumulation purposes. **Prof. Lindeman is visiting Utkal University, Bhubaneswar, IMI Kolkata, Ambedkar College, Delhi University, Zakir Hussain College, Delhi University and Cluster Innovation Centre at Delhi University to give special lectures and talks.** We hope for a fruitful and productive outcome of this Academic Exchange Programme between SLC and the three State Universities from Finland under CIMO project.

2 Best Practices

2.1 Solar Power

The Solar Power plant of the College is fully functional and generates power for our consumption and whenever there is any surplus it goes back to Delhi homes. **The Solar Power plant, installed in the college, is a collaborative initiative with IPGCL, Govt. of NCT of Delhi wherein the said govt. agency has borne the full cost of the installation of the Solar panels in the college.** We have been saving power as well as financial resources since the plant became fully functional. The College also practices regular switch off drives so as to save and conserve energy.

The College has undergone a green audit and has been given a satisfactory performance certificate. **A considerable dip has been observed in the electricity bill of last five months.** This is majorly because of the College's growing dependence on Solar Power. This successful energy conserving step could be seen as an achievement in itself.

2.2 Green Initiative

Go Green Initiative: Conservation of environment has been focus of assurance of the college. The students and faculty of the college work in coordination to cultivate and preserve a green environment.

- The College has collaboration with an **NGO, Jaagruti for Recycling of Paper**, where they collect all waste paper from the campus and give the College file covers, folders and paper sheet and other items in return. **Recently, we got more than 500 reams of recycled paper out of our own waste.**

- The college is a **tobacco-free**, smoke-free zone and has said a loud ‘NO’ to crackers and plastic bags.
- The college takes special care to inculcate the habit of switching off fans and lights when these are not in use.
- All **garden waste** is used for making **compost in compost pits**.
- Burning of garden waste is strictly prohibited on the Campus to **minimize air pollution**.
- **E waste** is routed through appropriate channels for proper disposal
- In order to ensure **safe drinking water**, the College has installed ROs in the campus.
- Colleges also engages in **tree plantation** in and around the campus.
- **Renewable energy** in the college is also important focuses and is equipped with **solar power**.
- College took efforts for **carbon neutrality**, with large green-patches, gardens, and a vast collection of trees.
- College has installed **three LED screens** to communicate with students and faculty to **reduce the use of paper in printing official notices** etc
- The College is increasingly shifting to the use of **LED lights**.
- E-waste generated in the campus is managed as per the E-Waste Management through a committee. The **E-waste is disposed off to authorized recyclers**.
- The Garden Committee attempts to ensure the use of **natural fertilizers and natural material** for supporting plants and climbers.

2.3 Rain Water Harvesting

As an institution committed to **zero water wastage** and harnessing the power of every drop of this precious commodity, SLC has taken important measure like installing rain water harvesting system.

2.4 Recycling Papers

SLC is sensitive towards the cause of conserving natural resources and promote the culture of respecting nature. SLC in collaboration with NGO Jaagruti has started recycling of waste papers and in **return has received more than 500 reams of paper**.

2.5 LED Lights

The **usage of LED lights has reduced the power consumption heavily**. The installation of LED lights following the installation of solar panels has helped the College to save its

financial resources. In addition to it, **switch-off drills** are carried on regular basis to make the SLCians aware and alert regarding energy consumption and saving.

2.6 Assessment and Feedback

SLC, in the past two years, has grown leaps and bounds in all the aspects relating to academics, infrastructure, student involvement as well as collaborations. The Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar has encouraged a lot of research-based, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities within the College. As a result, **one International and four National conferences** were organized by various departments of the College in the last one year. The departments conduct seminars and organize talks inviting eminent academicians from abroad as well as India for the academic welfare of the students and faculty. Various creative and innovative initiatives have been initiated in the college like **University Chef (promoting Skill India initiative)**, **VISAKA (promoting cashless transactions)**, CIISD, Skill Development Cell, Placement Cell, E-Cell, Ambedkar Study Circle, Gandhi Study Circle, Centre for Holistic Development and so on. **Under Project VISAKA, two of our student volunteers have been adjudged as the best Volunteers amongst 334 in the country and awarded Tablets by the Hon'ble MHRD Minister in a function at Delhi on 8th March 2017.** To keep the Institution upgraded **Green audit** of the campus and safety audits of the labs were also conducted in order to assess the infrastructural facilities of the college. Such assessments have helped the College to upgrade the Science labs. Various programmes/initiatives taken by the College are as follow:

- Eco-Club actively encouraged the campus through **“Go Green” initiative**. Currently, the Eco-Club is working on the amount of carbon emitted by the College. The other efforts like rain water harvesting, boards and signages etc. were undertaken.
- The College **hired an agent for E-waste for the better utilization of e-waste** from Computer labs, Admin and Principal's Office.
- The College has tied up with **Jaagruti** for recycling the waste papers of the College. **Jaagruti gave the College 500 reams of papers in return of the waste paper** given to it by the College.
- With the installation of **solar panels**, the College has been able to considerably control the expenses on Electricity with a **35% saving in the electricity bills**.

The College has also **successfully implemented the structured feedback system** that ensures that the concerns of the students are heard and addressed. So far we have **successfully completed two cycles of taking feedback** from the students that have been analyzed and the following issues have been addressed:

- More Curriculum based talks and seminars.
- The concept of **Mentorship** for more personal attention to the students for their academic and professional growth after graduation
- An **Alumni Association** was formed to give the SLC alumni involvement a more defined face.
- Updated timetables, notices and office orders on **LED display screens**.
- Change in the Office layout for more professional outlook making student friendly.
- A **workshop and a destressing trip were conducted specifically for the non-teaching staff** focusing on professionalism and ethics.
- Basic amenities have been improved in the College

2.7 Opportunities for neighbourhood under-privileged School children to participate/coaching facility for different games

Shyamlal College is the forecast college in East Delhi Campus of the University of Delhi with outstanding sports facilities for games like Hockey, Baseball, Volleyball, Judo, and Kabaddi. The College aims at promotion and improvement of sports and games in trans-Yamuna region of Delhi by providing opportunities and best coaching facilities to the young and talented players of the society. The endeavor is to provide a platform to young talented players with state of the art amenities so that they learn, train and improve their standard in sports and games, and excel at the International and national level. For the purpose, the **college has taking a new initiative to provide free and regular coaching in the above mentioned games to deserving and talented students from neighboring schools**. The aim is also to promote indigenous games among the youth who are in some ways unaware of the vast career possibilities to be explored in our national games and sports. **Under the scheme, various regular activities/programs and coaching camps will be organized, and the players would be provided with professional counselling for sports career, playfield and**

coaches. The scheme also facilitates participation of selected and groomed players in major tournaments so as to expose them to higher levels of competitions.

2.8 Active participation in Cashless & Digital India

The College understanding its accountability towards the financial resources has decided to adopt the practice of “Cashless” under “Digital India”.

The College has very efficiently and dedicatedly participated in MHRD's Digital Economy Project Vittiya Saksharata Abhiyan (VISAKA). **The team has been able to convert 1000 households and about 200 vendors to adopt digital modes of payment. Within the College, the faculty are encouraged for adopting digital payment for payments made to vendors, the College canteen and others. The Placement Cell conducted a seminar on “DIGITAL MARKETING AND ITS IMPORTANCE”. The purpose was to acquaint students with the latest developments in the concept of cashless economy and what would be its probable future.**

2.9 University Chef (Skill India)

University Chef 2017 was an inception of the Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who provided all the required encouragement to the participants, the Host Team including the very active Volunteers. **Season FOUR kicked off** on 16th February in the college premises on which three prelim rounds were held namely: (1) Cutting and Chopping Round; (2) Cold Round (basically, sandwich and the likely items); (3) Quiz Round. The participants were well-versed and showcased their talent in culinary art. All performed exceptionally well and were cheered and encouraged by the guest Chefs as well. Finally, five teams were eliminated.

The second day of this season was held on 17th feb 2017 **with Master class by Master chef Fame Jatin Khurana** and main rounds of full three course meal such as Starters, Main dishes and sweet dish. **Teams came from colleges such as Vivekanand College, Laxmi Bai College, Kirori Mal College, Deen Dayal Upadhyay College, Aurobindo college, Shyam Lal College (both Morning & Evening), Institute of Hotel Management** who displayed huge enthusiasm in all rounds of cooking, preparing the dishes, presentation skills and so on.

Celebrity Chef Nita Mehta was part of the event as a distinguished Jury member and as a Guest of Honour, of course other than prominent Chefs and hoteliers from Hotel Samrat such

as Sous Chef Mr. Mukesh Kumar and Ms. Veeta Singh from Hotel Janpat. Mr. Jatin Khurana of Master Chef of India Fame was another member of the Jury at the mega event. Nita Mehta gave valuable culinary tips to all the participants spoke at length on the value of good cooking, different areas that young chefs need to attend to and how one can give attention to minute details while being easy and creative at the same time in culinary expedition.

The Event was inaugurated by Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar along with Prof Munim K. Barai from Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University, Japan through a ribbon-cutting ceremony. The event also comprised of a conversation between Ms. Veeta Singh and Nita Mehta which was an inspiring part of the second day providing huge learning for all. In her final remarks, she congratulated all the winning teams—Winner being awarded to Shyam Lal College, Runner up being Laxmi Bai College and IIIrd Position going to Deen Dayal Upadhyay College.

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The IQAC of the College, formed last academic session, has taken many pioneer steps and crucial decisions to enhance the overall academic, administrative and co-curricular environment of the College.

National Workshop: The IQAC, under the guidance of the Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, took a pioneer initiative to organize a **one day National Workshop on e-Learning and MOOCs: Pedagogical Innovations and e-Learning in collaboration with Guru Angad Dev Teaching Learning Centre (GAD-TLC) of MHRD on 25th January, 2017**. This was the first workshop of its kind in any higher education institution that aims to expose the teachers directly to the advance developments in the field of e-Learning in India. The workshop was well attended by the faculty members from SLC as well as from other colleges of Delhi University. This workshop offered a platform to all academics and teachers to understand and get familiarized with the new pedagogical approaches being developed through MOOCs and other e-Learning portals introduced by the Government of India. We as teachers in the institutions of higher learning are witness to major transformations and changes happening in the world of academics with the Government of India's initiative to make e-Learning an integral part of the education system in the country. The workshop was conducted by eminent resource persons associated with GAD-TLC - Prof. A.K. Bakhshi, Vice-Chancellor, PDM University and Chairman GAD-TLC, Prof. K.V Bhanumurthy, Former Dean Faculty of Commerce and Business and Head Department of Commerce, University of Delhi and Dr. Vimal Rarh, senior Faculty at SGTB Khalsa College and Joint Director, GAD-TLC. The workshop and the subsequent interaction had a fruitful outcome in familiarizing the participants with the MHRD project of creating and facilitating the e-learning database in the fields of higher education. The Workshop was also accompanied by Republic Day celebrations in the College wherein the Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar hoisted the National Flag along with other teachers and students followed by the National Voter's Day oath ceremony and a spectacular dance performance by a SLC student, who is a classical trained dancer, on 'Vande Matram'.

Faculty Development Programme : “Teaching with Case Studies” was organized by the **Department of Commerce and IQAC**, SLC on November 21-23, 2016. The FDP was attended by 47 academicians teaching multi-disciplinary streams in various Colleges and academic institutions of repute across the country. The Inaugural session was addressed by the College Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar where he focused on the relevance of innovative and out of the box teaching methods in the routine classrooms in the contemporary scenario. The first session was taken by **Prof. K.V. Bhanumurthy, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi and Prof. Kavita Sharma, Head of Department of Commerce, University of Delhi. In the next session the College Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar discussed the way a teacher influences a student’s life by drawing a comparison of a teacher with a manager.** He emphasized on the significance of KASH (Knowledge, Attitude, Skill and Habits) as a potent tool for an educator to effectively impart learning among students. Other resource persons of the FDP were Prof. J.K. Mitra, former Dean, FMS, University of Delhi, Dr. Niti Bhasin from Department of Commerce, University of Delhi, Prof. Harsh Vardhan Verma, FMS, University of Delhi, Prof. N.K. Kakkar, MAIMS.

Training Programme : SLC, being a pioneer Delhi University College in east Delhi, has taken yet another step towards achieving institutional excellence. SLC has become the first college in DU to have organized a **Training Programme for the Office staff on “Smart Office Administration”**. This three day training programme, organized by the **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**, is an important initiative that would facilitate the process of enhancing skills, capabilities and knowledge of the Office staff. Training programmes are crucial for organizational development and success and contribute to the overall work productivity of an institution. This training programme spread over three days had expert speakers and participants from academic institutions and other organizations. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. S.C. Prusty, Registrar, Indian Law Institute who focused on explaining how smart office administration involves not only smooth office workings but also involves developing and maintaining healthy interpersonal interactions. Other resource persons included **Prof. Sunita Singh Sen Gupta, FMS University of Delhi, Dr. Vikas Gupta, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi, Prof. S.S Khanka, NIFM, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, Dr. T. Vengadesan, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi, Prof. I.M Kapahi, Member UGC.** The idea to organize such a training programme was conceptualized by our Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who also took the initiative of taking feedback from all our stakeholders on infrastructural, administrative and academic aspects related to the College. The

feedback provided insights into the skills and behavior desired in the institution to accomplish the vision, mission, and maintain a desired culture of excellence. To achieve these objectives, SLC has taken many pioneer steps such as the digitization of the whole administrative work including Library, Office and Accounts that has streamlined and smoothed the office operations. This is a pioneer initiative taken by SLC to encourage and promote smart office management, and to improve the work environment and work potential of the administrative workforce.

4.1 Department of Chemistry and Physics

A two day National workshop on **Nanotechnology: Emerging Frontiers and Applications (NEFA2017)** took place over a two-day period (30-31, January 2017). Representatives from the organizing institutions gave their perspectives on nanotechnology innovations, nanoscience education, and collaborations to support the development of a new nanoscience technologies. One hundred and forty (**140 participants and 40 Volunteers**) participated in the workshop. The program included several keynote talks addressing the state-of-the-art in nanoscience and technology. This was followed by several individual oral presentations. The purpose of the Workshop was to review the current state of knowledge in the field of nanoscience and technology along with their novel applications and challenges.

An inspirational fest – **QUANTUM-2016-17** was held by Fiz-iks Society on 19th January, 2017 under the convenorship of Dr. Seema Dabas, Teacher-in-Charge of the Physics Department. This Fest is organised every year with the objective to provide platform for students to showcase their talent in academics as well as cultural fields. Students compete with their peers in a myriad of events with a competitive spirit.

Volunteer team was selected by faculty co-ordinators, who work as a backbone for staff members and organisers of the fest in arranging and compiling the fest. Jury members were decided for different events. Screening were held by the teachers for each and every event, in which the participants show case their raw talent, and after their selection in screening students got to know

their feedbacks and rules of the events. A day before the fest was a brain storming day for each of the participants, anchors, volunteers and specially for the staff members.

4.2 Department of Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics, Shyam Lal College, University of Delhi organized two days **Faculty Development Programme on “Computer Algebra System and Latex”** on 16-17 February, 2017. The FDP was attended by academicians teaching multidisciplinary streams in various colleges and reputed academic institution across the country. The dignitaries were welcomed by our principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar along with Mr. Balram Kindra, convener and Mr. Subodh Kumar, organizing secretary of the FDP. 4.3 Department of Commerce

Barai (APU,Japan) delivered the keynote speech from College of Management, APU, Japan where he dealt with how the new shape of global order is emerging in international business and trade in the coming 50 years and the position of India.

The Department of Commerce and IQAC, Shyam Lal College, University of Delhi have organized a three day **Faculty Development Programme on Teaching with Case Studies** during November 21-23, 2016. **The FDP was attended by 47 academicians teaching multidisciplinary streams in various Colleges** and academic institutions of repute across the country. The inaugural session was taken by the College Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who focused on the relevance of innovative and out of box teaching methods in the routine classrooms in the contemporary scenarios. In his next session, Dr. Kar talked about to adopting case bare method of teaching for better class delivery and reception by students.

Prof. Jay Mitra, Dean & Head, Faculty of Management Studies, University of Delhi also took a session and ran some case studies with the participants. Prof. Harsh Vardha, Professor, Faculty of Management Studies, University of Delhi, Dr. Niti Bhasin, Associate Professor, Department of

Commerce, Delhi School of Economics. Prof. N.K.Kakkad, EC member, Jawahar Lal Nehru University took the final session where he applauded and the efforts of the department and also emphasized on the need of innovative techniques including use of Cinema for better class delivery.

Other Resource persons of the event included Prof. K.V. Bhanumurthy, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi and Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, principal, SLC. He emphasised on the significance of KASH (Knowledge, Attitude, Skill and Habits) as a potent tool for an educator to effectively impart learning among students.

ELFESTO'17 Inter-college **Commerce Fest** organized on 9-10, Feb,2017 Shyam Lal College (SLC) has always been mentoring the students beyond the conceptual teaching learning pedagogy as inspired by the Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar. The events included: Negothlon:The Negotiation War, Qfiesta :The Bizz Quiz, Business Tambola, Poster Making, Impromptu:The Extempore, Biz-Boss:The Business Idea, Mock Stock, Mock CID, Ad-SelFie and The Ad-Mad Show. There were participants from various colleges of Delhi University, IP University and Amity University. The prizes were bagged by the students from Laxmi Bai College, Satyawati College (E), Rajdhani College, Vivekanand College, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, Sri Venkateshwara College, SLC (E) and the Host College - SLC itself. The Band Performance by SLC Band “Insignia” and the Exhibition-cum-Sale of the products made by SLC students acted as a sweet dessert to the meal.

4.4 B.A. Programme

Collection and Distribution of woollen clothes and blankets to the poor and needy people from 6th to 14th January, 2017

In order to facilitate a sense of belongingness and to encourage interaction among the students, a **Freshers' Party** was organized on 8th October, 2016 welcoming the newcomers to the Course.

Information Literacy Programme for BA Programme students for using **E-resources and OPAC** was organized in the College Library (ground floor) on 18.1.2017. The Power Point presentation and practical demonstration of its use was given by college Librarian Sh. V. K. Bajpai, Library staff Mr. Umang Jain, Mr. Vishan Singh, Ms. Neema Bedwal and teachers Mr. Rahul Tomar and Mr. Sushil Kr. were present there to assist the students for practical training of using these facilities in their day to day engagements in the College. The event was extremely

beneficial to the students as they were informed about how to use e-library system. The students will be able to access large number of books of their concern by using their user id from online platforms. Useful information regarding different databases and OPAC was demonstrated which was extremely useful for the students.

B.A Programme Society, SLC organized **Public Lecture on "Discipline, Dedication & Duty : Life and Career in Armed Forces"** by one of the most visible faces in the media Major Gen. P. K. Saigal (Rtd.) Indian Armed Force, his address and further interaction with students was spellbound. He, further, inspired the youth to join the Forces by drawing from his own experiences over 40 years in the Forces.

4.5 Department of Economics

The Department of Economics organised a **one day workshop on "How to draft a Research Proposal"** by the Speaker of Dr. Pradeep Kumar Chaudhary, Jawaharlal Nehru University on 6 October, 2016. The speaker devoted meaningful suggestions to the students for drafting an impressive research proposal. Various discipline students participated in large numbers in the workshop.

The Department of Economics also organized a **one-day seminar on "Impact of Demonetization on Indian Economy"** on 19 January, 2017. The day started with an indepth analysis of the Demonstration by our Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar. Dr. Kumar Bijoy, the Head of the Department of Management Studies at Shaheed Sukhdev College, University of Delhi also addressed the students. The lecture was followed by an inter-college debate and quiz competition.

Department of Economics, SLC celebrated their 7th two day inter-college **Annual Fest ECONOMICA'17** on 28th Feb and 1st March 2017. The two-day fest was an intelligent merge up of economic themes and fun games. After the inauguration, four competitions were held such as (a) Bullseyes: It's all about Stock Market; (b) Just-a-minute: Chase the time to show it all; (c) Battle of Clicks: Photography Competition; (d) Brand-o-Maniac: quiz related with brand logo and (e) Craft Bazar: showcase of art and craft by students. Economics students from Delhi University colleges like Venkateshwara College, Vivekanand College, Maharaja Agresen College, Dayal Singh College, Ram Lal Anand College, Daulat Ram College, Hindu college, Indraprastha college and IIT Delhi came and participated with great enthusiasm.

The second day of the Fest opened with a **Lecture on the topic “Budget 2017”** delivered by Dr. J. C. Sharma, Senior Economic Advisor, (Retd.) and IES officer, with Dr. V. K. Puri (Retd.) of Shyam Lal College Economics department as the Chair. The 2nd day also had competitions like (a) Paper Presentation on topics such as “Budget 2017: Progressive or Regressive”, “Inclusive Growth with special reference to health and education sector”, and “Economics behind Digitalization”; (b) Treasure Hunt and (c) Bizzathon: related with entrepreneur skills. This event was organized in collaboration with the E-Cell under the convenership of Dr. Bharat Bhushan.

The Fest was concluded with a remarkable Street Play by Aakrosh, College Street Play society on the topic **“Demonetization and Cashless Economy”**. Shyam Lal College Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar encouraged all the participants, the Economics Society members and the volunteers for their hard work and dedication.

4.6 Department of English

Department of English, under the guidance of the Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, came up with idea of **Spoken English Course** for the students of the College. The course primarily was meant for those students who face difficulties and are unable to acquire English language skills properly. Thereupon, through a collective effort of the Department and valuable inputs from the Principal, a module was drafted. **The basic structure of the Module was prepared keeping in view the NPTEL Spoken English course module.** However, the Department felt that since the course is meant for the beginners, it would be better to arrange the content module according to the requirements of the SLC students.

In its final package, the course was designed as a Six Week Spoken English Course (four days per week) and though primary focus was on spoken English, it also included reading and writing sections other than speaking and listening.

The response from the students was overwhelming. In its introductory session the Seminar Hall was jam-packed and students enthusiastically wanted to be the part of it. Dr. Kar, the principal, addressed the students intimating them about the importance of English in social and corporate realms. He also appreciated the effort of English Department.

The sessions were interactive, informative and interesting. **The usage of videos, hand-outs, stories, comics, suggestive books and interesting worksheets helped the students to grasp the tips to learn and understand English language.** There were brain-storming sessions, debates, group activities and impromptu presentations which enhanced the confidence level of the

students. The Course ran its entire course of weeks and also took informal inputs from the students for making the course better next time. The Course is being successfully conducted in the current semester with certain modifications in the content module wherein the course would run for four weeks and the students would be getting course completion certificates.

Department of English, SLC organized a **Virtual Lecture on “Post-apartheid Literature and the Postcolonial Discourse”** as part of the SLC Public Lecture Series on 2nd Feb, 2017 with **Prof. Michael Chapman, Professor emeritus and fellow at the University of KwaZulu-Natal (Durban)**. Prof. Chapman began his lecture by talking about how literature cannot be utterly divorced from its context in politically dynamic societies.

His talk mainly focused on questioning the global tendency to homogenize the African literature whereas Africa is a continent comprising of 60 odd countries. Thus there is no one African literature rather there are African literatures coming from different localities with their own flavor and conflicts. The lecture ended with students asking questions and interacting with Prof. Chapman. The Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar formally thanked Prof. Chapman for the engaging interaction and also talked of the possibility of having him physically with us the next time.

LITEPHILIA 2017. A Literary fest was organized by LITWORMS, Literary society of Shyam Lal College on 20th and 21st March, 2017. Over the period of two days, many interesting events were organised. On day 1, Microtale (Inter College), Monoact (Inter College) and Treasure Hunt (Intra College) witnessed active participation from the students. On day 2, an interaction was organised for the students on the **topic “Theatre and Literature”**. The Speaker of the day was **Prof. Dilip K. Basu**. Besides the Talk, the other events like Connectors, Mini Militia and Online Poetry were organized for the entertainment of the students.

The English Literary Society, LITWORMS of Shyam Lal College (Morning) organized a quiz competition **QUIZZICAL** on 8th February, 2017. Based on three popular series *Friends*, *The Games of Thrones* and *Harry Potter*, a quiz was organised. The quiz comprised of three rounds. Such as :-

4.8 Department of Political Science

The Department of Political Science in collaboration with The Gandhi Study Circle, organized a one day seminar on **“Gandhi in the New Millennium”** on 30 January 2017. The main speaker to the seminar was Dr. Anil Kumar Mishra. It introduced the students to the unexplored Gandhi and his growing relevance in the times that we are living. The seminar started with the felicitation of the speaker that was followed with his in-depth study and research oriented speech of Gandhian thoughts and ideas that are more relevant to the world torn apart by terrorism and greed for natural resources. After the speech Dr. Neena Shireesh, Teacher-in-Charge of the department of Political Science Shyam Lal College expressed her thoughts on Gandhi and his ideas in the new millennium. Then the floor was thrown open to the students to ask questions to the speaker. Many students commented or questioned about their notions of Gandhiji and his relevance to the modern world

The seminar **“Electoral Reforms in India”** was organized by the Department of Political Science in the year 2016. The seminar became all the more relevant as the topic is because of the presence such well known speakers as Prof. Jagdeep Chokker, Prof. Anand Kumar and Amlesh Raju- (Journalist, Janasatta). All the speakers illuminated students’ knowledge with their thorough understanding of the topic and their expertise in putting the issue in simple, clear and crisp manner that enchants and keeps the audience glued to the topic.

The Political Science Society of the department of Political Science of Shym Lal College did the screening of a movie **“Suffragette”** in the month of October 2016. This movie is a 2015 British historical period drama film about women's suffrage in the United Kingdom, directed by Sarah Gavron and written by Abi Morgan was screened to expose students to the world women’s

suffering 2016. The film stars Carey Mulligan, Helena Bonham Carter, Brendan Gleeson, AnneMarie Duff, Ben Whishaw, and Meryl Streep. The idea behind screening of a movie is to expose student to the suffering of women and the fight they waged to claim their rights. The department believes that the thoughts and ideas of feminism should just not remain confined to books and theories therein but students should get glimpses of actual situation thorough such endeavors.

4.9 Department of Physical Education

The Sports Committee remained active throughout the academic session 2016-2017 in its involvement with students' participation in various games at National as well as University levels. Our students have participated at both National and Inter-Varsity levels in different categories, also secured positions in Inter College tournament and won prizes and brought laurels to the College. Achievements are highlighted as under:

A. This academic year remained unique in the sense that the Department of Physical Education under the Sports Committee of the College followed the tradition and hence organized the 6th Padmashree Shyam Lal Memorial Invitational Hockey Tournament (Men & Women) in the fond memory of our beloved and Founder Chairman of our College to encourage the young minds and the athletes of this University to become successful players for this country. This edition of the Tournament began from February 28, 2017 to March 8, 2017 with an innovation whereby 6 teams of women from various Colleges / Institutions of Delhi University were invited to participate in the tournament alongwith 8 teams of Men from the same as usual in the inspiring presence of the Arjuna Awardee & Hockey Olympion Mr. Jagbir Singh, , Former International Player, Sh. Kiran Pal Rana, & Chairperson of the College Governing Body, Smt. Savita Gupta and Governing Body Member, Prof. C.K.Jaggi & Prof. A.K.Prasad alongwith representatives from print and electronic media, coaches and professors of Physical Education and teachers of the Colleges. B. Team Achievements:

The two days comprised of incisive and insightful discussions on various facets of the issue of gender as reflected and refracted through the prism of popular culture. S.C Prusty (Registrar, ILI), Prof. Shuchi Sinha (IIT, Delhi), Ms. Nandita Pilania (Mazars India), Ms. Sumati Sharma (BHEL), Dr. Minakshi Kar (University of Delhi).** The Conference Paper Review Committee was constrained by time to accept only 40 out of the more than 60 research papers received. All the resource persons conducted very engaging and fruitful sessions. The valedictory addresses of **Prof. Kavita A. Sharma, President, South Asian University, Delhi (Chief Guest), Sh. Sidharth Mishra, Consulting Editor, Millenium Post and Sh. Shakti Sinha, Director, Nehru Memorial Museum & Library - the Guest of Honour and Chairperson Smt. Savita Gupta** offered an apt conclusion to the conference with specific summing up of the theme of the conference and the acknowledgment of the efforts of the whole WDC team, Shyam Lal College and **the Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who inaugurated the valedictory session with the Power Point Presentation of the achievements of the College in the last few years that clearly stated that Brand SLC had arrived**, and there is nothing to stop it from marching forward. The Conference ended with these probable outcomes and conclusions: The Conference and its proceedings are a step towards making those involved and present more gender sensitive citizens of a society which needs to be jolted out of its regressive mind-sets. The conference was highly applauded for bringing together great minds from different fields of gender studies and activism. Their views and discussions made the audience see how gender is a fluid category and can be reshaped through active questioning and participative action. There was also an emphasis, especially in the plenary session discussions, to make the audience realise how the whole idea of 'agency'

and ‘gaze’ is changing with the changing perception of gender dominance and representation in the world of cinema. The event gave rise to discussions that looked critically at traditions and conservative rituals that have become part of the mainstream due to overexposure through representations in the popular mediums like TV, cinema. The conference also provided an active platform to discussions on the user centric nature of social media that apparently becomes a medium for peripheral voices to be heard and at the same it is to be seen whether it, in reality, is liberating or confining. The conference became first of its kind initiative by Women Development Cell of a College in showing the immense possibilities of debates, discussions, exposure to current developments in the field of women’s studies and issues that can be explored through such forums. The Conference has shown the way as to what can be achieved through such events that are supported by **organizations like Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), ICSSR and UGC** and have the active participations from students and academics.

a) Faculty Development Programmes

5.2.1 “Teaching with Case Studies”

A three day Faculty Development Programme on **Teaching with Case Studies** was organized by **Department of Commerce & IQAC of Shyam Lal College** during November 21-23, 2016. The FDP was attended by 47 academicians teaching multidisciplinary streams in various Colleges and academic institutions of repute across the country. **The inaugural session was addressed by the College Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who focused on the relevance of innovative and out of box teaching methods in the routine classrooms in the contemporary scenarios.** In the first session, Prof. K.V. Bhanumurthy, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi enlightened the relevance of including practical cases in the discourse with the students in class. Professor shared his views on the Practice Based Learning (PBL), Case Based Teaching and Good Practices in Research. In the next session chaired by College Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar discussed the way a teacher influences a student's life by drawing a comparison of a teacher with a manager. He led emphasis on the significance of **KASH (Knowledge, Attitude, Skill and Habits) as a potent tool for an educator** to effectively impart learning among students. In the followed session the participants felt privileged to have Prof. Kavita Sharma, Head of Department of Commerce, University of Delhi as a resource person. The audience witnessed a great show of her expertise on the issue as she began by pointing possible reasons why people abstain from using case study method of teaching and gradually suggested ways so that teachers learn to ensure that their classes evolve with the cases discussed. The participants delighted with the first day's interaction, reassembled on the second day of the FDP. Prof. J.K. Mitra, former Dean, FMS, University of Delhi narrated his experiences from Harvard Business School and IIM of delivering knowledge supported with the case based studies. His vast horizon of experience recommended the audience to greet all sort of responses from students. In the following session of the FDP, Dr. Niti Bhasin from Department of Commerce, University of Delhi settled the academic scores by saying that how a concise and acquainted Case study helps the audience to arrive at inductive reasoning. Dr. Bhasin admired the beauty of such pedagogy as they lack carrying the similar ideas from the target audience. Prof. Harsh Vardhan Verma, FMS, University of Delhi shared his notions of the ease of explanation with the assistance of Cases. He also bridged the gap between the theoretical concepts of Marketing of services and Brand Management to the ground zero of practical issues. Prof. N.K. Kakkar, MAIMS maintained the discussion vibrant on the final day of FDP. He insisted the participants to keep the conversation of Case studies as multidisciplinary in the initial phase and then later on filter out the concepts to be discussed in the class. All the sessions in FDP had a vibrant two way discussion with an equally participative audience. The valedictory session of the FDP has given a chance to fellow faculty members to thank the College for providing this learning arena. The report of FDP was presented by Convenor, Dr. Kavita Arora.

5.3.1 Transitional Turmoil: End Shape of the Global Order in 21st Century

Organizing Department: Department of Commerce

The Commerce Association of SLC organized a Seminar on “**Transitional Turmoil: End Shape of the Global Order in 21st Century**”. The resource person for the same was **Professor Munim K. Barai, APU, JAPAN on 16th February 2017**. Prof. Barai explained that the world is passing through a crossroad as the multi-polarity in the world order is now a distinctive possibility in the 21st Century. In that emergence, the center of global economic gravity is seemingly moving toward the Asia Pacific zone. The USA, the sole superpower in the present order, is increasingly facing challenges from China, Russia and other rising powers like India and Brazil.

5.3.2 Impact of Demonetization on Indian Economy

In addition to this, he also informed everyone that in support of demonetization the College has now gone totally cashless and has taken an initiative to help the surrounding areas to become cashless as well. The **Placement Cell** of the College organized a seminar on "**Resume Writing and Effective Official Communication**", to provide students assistance for a perfect resume building. The seminar took place on Wednesday, 21st September 2016. The Speaker of the day Mr. Neel Panicker from Triumphant Institute of Management Education (T.I.M.E.) who has a Master's in Business Administration and has been guiding aspirants seeking admission in prestigious B schools for more than a decade addressed an audience of 170 students and 5 teachers. The speaker talked about the insights, as a resume becomes the face of the candidate for the interviewer it should highlight all the relevant details, it should be written in a style that the

weaknesses can also be treated as a strength. He further talked about keeping the resume precise and making it distinct from others. He not only enlightened the students with some great tips but also left them mesmerized by focusing on the little mistakes they might commit while writing a resume.

5.4.1 UNION BUDGET 2017

Organizing Department: B. A. Programme

UNION BUDGET 2017 by Dr. J.C. Sharma. Some of the key points of the FRBM Act, 2003 and Rules, 2004 and major trends in the Fiscal Deficit of India was also discussed before glancing through four documents of the budget presented by the Finance Minister, namely: i) Mandated by the constitution, ii) FRBM mandated, iii) Expenditure and Receipt and iv) Explanatory documents. Broadly, the lecture reviewed major aspects of the Union Budget 2017 from the point of view of growth, inter-personal equity, inter-regional equity, macroeconomic stability and MTFPS indicators. An outlook for the year 2018-19 and 2019-20 and fiscal consolidation and sustainability for the year 2016-17 was also discussed.

5.4.2 Virtual Lecture: Post-apartheid Literature and the Postcolonial Discourse

Organizing Department: Department of English

Virtual Lecture organized by **Department of English**, SLC organized a Virtual Lecture on “**Post-apartheid Literature and the Postcolonial Discourse**” as part of the SLC Public Lecture

Series on 2nd Feb, 2017 with **Prof. Michael Chapman, a Professor emeritus and fellow at the University of KwaZulu-Natal (Durban)**. Prof. Chapman began his lecture by talking about how literature cannot be utterly divorced from its context in politically dynamic societies. He emphasized on how South Africa has seen new voices in the fields of literature coming to the forefront in the post-apartheid times. His talk mainly focused on questioning the global tendency to homogenize the African literature whereas Africa is a continent comprising of 60 odd countries. Thus there is no one African literature rather there are African literatures coming from different localities with their own flavor and conflicts. He went on to deconstruct the term ‘post-colonial’ and ‘de-colonial thinking’. He went on to discuss Nadine Gordimer’s *My Son’s Story* and how Gordimer’s ‘essential gesture’ became her ‘necessary gesture’ during apartheid. He concluded his talk by talking about the recent trends in literature in South Africa. The lecture ended with students asking questions and interacting with Prof. Chapman. The Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar formally thanked Prof. Chapman for the engaging interaction and also talked of the possibility of having him physically with us the next time.

5.4.3 Gond Paintings: ‘Art’iculating Bhimayana by Roshni Vyam

Organizing Department: Department of English

The speaker was **Roshni Vyam, daughter of well-known Gond artists Durgabhai and Subhash Vyam who did the artwork for Bhimayana: Experiences of Untouchability**. The text is a prescribed text for English Hons students and deals with Ambedkar's reminiscences of the social discrimination faced by him in school as a young adult on the account of his caste. Roshni Vyam elucidated on the Pradhan Gond art which uses lines in such a way that it conveys a sense of movement to still images. The digna patterns, explained Roshni, were the traditional auspicious designpatterns applied to walls and floors in Gond homes. The art work for Bhimayana used the digna patterns and nature imagery to signify experiences of social discrimination. After the talk there was an exhibition of Roshni Vyam's paintings. The students were able to see the depth and beauty of the Gond art which had evolved from using natural colours from charcoal, coloured soil, plant sap, leaves, cow dung on the walls of Gond homes to poster colours on canvas. The talk was well attended and the audience included students and faculty members from other colleges also. Both the Talk and the Exhibition were well received with the audience asking wide ranging questions and expressing deep appreciation of the paintings exhibited.

5.4.4 “POSTCOLONIALITY AND GENDER”

Organizing Department: Department of English

The English Department, Shyam Lal College organised a **talk on the topic "Postcoloniality and Gender"** on 29th July 2016. The resource persons for this talk session were **Prof. Mehr Afshan Farooqi from the University of Virginia and Prof. Baran Farooqi from Jamia Millia Islamia**. The session began with the welcome address by the Principal, Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, who appreciated the initiative taken by the department to provide exposure to the students. Prof. Mehr Afshan Farooqi's lecture began with a general overview of the concepts of time, modernity and colonialism. Prof. Mehr questioned the idea of linear time and emphasized on the presentness of past and vice-versa. She also went on to point out how modernity became desirable in colonial era during which the colonized subject who were not modern were termed as nonprogressive. Thus comes the idea of multiple modernities that challenge the implied judgmental value to the non-European lifestyles. Prof. Mehr concluded by arguing that the non-European progressive outlook promotes the idea of compositeness in place of linear modernity. Prof. Baran Farooqi approached the topic through specific works - Ismat Chughtai's "The Housewife" and Manto's "Kali Salwar". Going beyond the categories of colonial and postcolonial, she explored the existence of a third space, the "non-colonial" which was brought to life by Chughtai and Manto in their work. Through a stimulating reading /discussion of the two short stories, Prof. Farooqi encouraged the students to think about a range of issues which continue to be relevant today, such as women's relation to their own bodies. The two lectures were followed by an interactive session wherein the students came up with interesting questions and insightful observations.

5.4.5 **International Congress: The Last Girl First: World Congress Against Sexual Exploitation**

Organizing Department/Cell: Women Development Cell

SLC students, with the encouragement from the Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar and under the mentorship of Dr. Kusha Tiwari, participated in the three day International Congress on The Last Girl First: World Congress Against Sexual Exploitation as volunteers. This was a great opportunity provided to them by SLC and Apne Aap Women Worldwide. **“TO BE A PROSTITUTE IS NOT A CHOICE”**. This line is quoted by APNE-AAP’S founder Ruchira Gupta who introduced “The Last Girl First: World Congress Against Sexual Exploitation”. The agenda of this congress is to take care of that last girl who is low caste, poor, marginalized and is a woman of color. SLC students got an opportunity to participate and contribute in the success of this International Congress held from 29th to 31st January 2017. It was 29th January, 2017 when we, the student volunteers, stepped into Indian International Center wearing T-shirts that read:

SEX IS NOT WORK OUR BODIES ARE NOT FOR SALE:- APNE The Congress saw participants from countries like Canada, South Africa, Bangladesh, India. This International Congress exposed them to the modalities involved in the organization of such large scale events.

The seminar took place on Wednesday, 21st September 2016. The Speaker of the session was Mr. Neel Panicker from Triumphant Institute of Management Education (T.I.M.E).

6.3.5 How to Excel in Group Discussion and Personal Interviews

A seminar on “How to Excel in Group Discussion and Personal Interviews” was organised on 13th January, 2017. It was held on the occasion of internships offered by M Sadashiv and Associates. The event was very informative.

6.3.6 Sustainable Livelihood for Differently-abled

The Enabling Unit of SLC in collaboration with Placement Cell organized a seminar on the topic, "Sustainable Livelihood for Differently Abled" in the College on March 23, 2017 for the benefit of its PwD students. During the seminar, Ms. Pooja and Mr. Shalesh of Dr. Reddys Foundation delivered talks and presentations. The Foundation represents the CSR initiative of Dr. Reddys Laboratory. It has been carrying out activities for under-privileged sections of society for over last two decades. The Foundation got information about the disabled friendly initiatives of SLC through Mr. Rizvan and Ms. Anchal, both alumni of SLC who have been having a close association with the Foundation for the last 3 years.

The seminar had been organized on ground floor for the convenience of OH students of the College. Invitation to attend the seminar had been extended to all students of the College to sensitize the non PwD students to the issues facing the differently abled and to bring about an environment of inclusiveness in SLC.

During the seminar, the speakers informed the students that the main problem in India is not unemployment but unemployability, and this is related largely to absence of appropriate skills, nor is this an issue facing PwD students alone. The Foundation through its seven centres in Delhi conducts two-month programs to impart such skills to PwD students. The skills imparted include communication skills, computer skills, language skills, etc. These programs are carried out free of any charge for most students (who happen to come from under-privileged sections of society). After the completion of the programs, the Foundation ensures provision of employment to the students, and assures a minimum salary of Rs. 10000/- to every student who completes the program. At the conclusion of the seminar, following a request from Ms. Pooja and Mr. Shalesh, they were shown around the facilities created by SLC for differently abled students. They also expressed the desire to have continued association between SLC and Dr. Reddys Foundation.

6.3.7 Placement Drive

SLC Placement Cell hosted two internship drives in which 59 students were selected. In addition to this, the registration of students on internship portals has also been facilitated.

9 Students Progression**9.1 Placement**

The College Placement Cell acts as an interface between the industry and the students and primarily enables the students to select career of their choice from among available options. It facilitates the selection process of all the companies as per their requirement. The Placement Cell liaisons with corporate/ organizations to provide suitable jobs for the candidates graduating from the college. It also liaisons for all those activities and issues assigned to it by the Principal.

9.1.1 Career Opportunities in Wealth Management

On 21st October 2016, the SLC Placement Cell organized a seminar on "**Career Opportunities in Wealth Management**".

The event was addressed by Mr. Rajiv Satija who is a financial service industry professional and runs a boutique Wealth Management firm by the name of UpMarket Financial Advisory Service (UFAS) which helps its clients to manage their personal finances and investment.

9.1.2 Placement Drive

In the **placement drive** conducted in the college on 26 February 2016, Mr. Kartik from the company Concentrix presented pre placement talk and video giving the details of the company.

The students who offered themselves for placement talk had to undergo elaborate selection process. **29 students were finally selected for the “Customer Service Executive” position with salary package of 2.6 lakh per annum.**

9.1.3 An interactive session on **Digital Marketing and its Importance**

On 24th January 2017, the SLC Placement Cell in association with Times Pro organized an interactive session on "**Digital Marketing and its Importance**". The seminar was addressed by Mr. Kanishk Matta who has been in this field from around 7 years, presently working in eQuest and has conducted many sessions for NIESBUD.

9.1.4 Resume Writing and Effective Official Communication

SLC Placement Cell of the college organized a seminar on “**Resume Writing and Effective Official Communication**”, to provide students assistance for a perfect resume building. The seminar took place on Wednesday, 21st September 2016. The Speaker of the session was Mr. Neel Panicker from Triumphant Institute of Management Education (T.I.M.E).

9.1.5 How to Excel in Group Discussion and Personal Interviews

A seminar on “How to Excel in Group Discussion and Personal Interviews” was organised on 13th January, 2017. It was held on the occasion of internships offered by M Sadashiv and Associates. The event was very informative.

9.1.6 Sustainable Livelihood for Differently-abled

The Enabling Unit of SLC in collaboration with Placement Cell organized a seminar on the topic, "Sustainable Livelihood for Differently Abled" in the College on March 23, 2017 for the benefit of its PWD students. During the seminar, Ms. Pooja and Mr. Shalesh of Dr. Reddys Foundation delivered talks and presentations. The Foundation represents the CSR initiative of Dr. Reddys Laboratory. It has been carrying out activities for under-privileged sections of society for over last two decades. The Foundation got information about the disabled friendly initiatives of SLC through Mr. Rizvan and Ms. Anchal, both alumni of SLC who have been having a close association with the Foundation for the last 3 years.

The seminar had been organized on ground floor for the convenience of OH students of the College. Invitation to attend the seminar had been extended to all students of the College to sensitize the non PWD students to the issues facing the differently abled and to bring about an environment of inclusiveness in SLC.

During the seminar, the speakers informed the students that the main problem in India is not unemployment but unemployability, and this is related largely to absence of appropriate skills, nor is this an issue facing PWD students alone. The Foundation through its seven centres in Delhi conducts two-month programs to impart such skills to PWD students. The skills imparted include communication skills, computer skills, language skills, etc. These programs are carried out free of any charge for most students (who happen to come from under-privileged sections of society). After the completion of the programs, the Foundation ensures provision of employment to the students, and assures a minimum salary of Rs. 10000/- to every student who completes the program. At the conclusion of the seminar, following a request from Ms. Pooja and Mr. Shalesh, they were shown around the facilities created by SLC for differently abled students. They also expressed the desire to have continued association between SLC and Dr. Reddys Foundation.

9.1.7 Placement Drive

SLC Placement Cell hosted two internship drives in which 59 students were selected. In addition to this, the registration of students on internship portals has also been facilitated.

9.2 Spoken English Classes

An alumni interaction was organised on 14th January, 2017 by newly formed SLC Alumni Association. The Association office bearers were unanimously selected and a few issues regarding the development of the Association and the College were discussed. The alumni who are now well placed in their respective fields attended the meeting. The alumni expressed their interest in continued alliance with the Association.

9.4 Upgrade Library Facilities

1712 books were added to our collection in various subjects e.g. Hindi, English, Pol. Science, History, Economics, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Commerce.

The Librarian gave **three Information Literacy Programmes** in collaboration with, B.A. (Programme) on 18/01/2017, Mathematics on 23/01/2017, and Physics department on 25/01/2017 where students were exposed to various E-Resources. Information Literacy programmes were organised to optimise the use of the library.

Library department organised **Book Exhibition** where College faculty publications were displayed on Friday 24th March 2017. Prof. Ari Lindman was the Chief Guest of the exhibition. All faculty members along with principal visited the exhibition.

10 Office Administration

10.1 Change in Office Layout

The Office set up has been reformed and made to look more professional, work-centric and easily accessible. The divisions of compartments have made the office organised and student-teacher friendly.

10.2 Training Programme

SLC, being a pioneer Delhi University College in East Delhi, has taken yet another step towards achieving institutional excellence. SLC has become the first college in DU to have

organized a Training Programme for the Office staff on “**Smart Office Administration**”. This three day training programme, organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), is an important initiative that would facilitate the process of enhancing skills, capabilities and knowledge of the Office staff. Training programmes are crucial for organizational development and success and contribute to the overall work productivity of an institution. This training programme spread over three days had expert speakers and participants from academic institutions and other organizations. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. S.C. Prusty, Registrar, Indian Law Institute who focused on explaining how smart office administration involves not only smooth office workings but also involves developing and maintaining healthy interpersonal interactions. He emphasized how organizations should work towards ensuring paperless administration and complete automation of the office dealings. Prof. Sunita Singh Sen Gupta, FMS University of Delhi, engaged the audience on the importance of maintaining a serene state of mind and environment in the workplace because that leads to improved work experience. The programme also had other eminent resource persons such as Dr. Vikas Gupta, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi; Prof. S.S Khanka, NIFM, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India; Dr. T. Vengadesan, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi; Prof. I.M Kapahi, Member UGC and Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar. The idea to organize such a training programme was conceptualized by our Principal Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar who also took the initiative of taking feedback from all our stakeholders on infrastructural, administrative and academic aspects related to the College. The feedback process provided insights into the skills and behavior desired in the institution to accomplish the vision, mission, and maintain a desired culture of excellence. To achieve these objectives, SLC has taken many pioneer steps such as the digitization of the whole administrative work including Library, Office and Accounts that has streamlined and smoothened the office operations.

10.3 Stress Management

10.3.1 TRIP TO ORC MANESER

CIISD and IQAC jointly organized a trip to Omshanti Retreat Centre (ORC), Manesar, Haryana on Saturday, 21/01/2017. ORC is a spiritual organization which conducts spiritual sessions for the participants. Thirty five participants - faculty as well as non-teaching employees - participated in the program. The group started from SLC at 7:30 am and reached ORC at 10:30 am. An interactive session was held after lunch and was on the topic of "Happiness". 11.4 Educational/Industrial Trips

11.4.1 Industrial Visit by CIISD to NEI JAIPUR

To provide a greater exposure to the students with regard to the existing opportunities and potential for growth in manufacturing, **SLC's Centre for Industry Interaction and Skill**

Development organized an industrial visit by 24 students and 4 accompanying faculty members to National Engineering Industries Ltd. (Jaipur plant) on February 17 and 18, 2017. The company, a part of the C.K. Birla Group, meets the requirements of bearings for an array of manufacturing industries, including automobile majors around the world as well as for American Railways and Indian Railways. Dr. Sharma responded that while most of the roles in the company are of a technical nature and involve the manufacturing process, opportunities do exist in support functions such as finance and logistics. Following the presentation and interaction, the students were shown around the 3 facilities that make up the process of manufacture of bearings, viz. heat treatment, grinding, and assembly. The visit was a huge learning experience for students of SLC, most of whom had never seen manufacturing operations of such a complex nature.
