## Eco-club (the\_last\_leaf) Shyam Lal College In collaboration with Department of Environment, Government of NCT, Delhi

The eco club students organised a green tour as a part of their project work (total of 10 students) to Tilpath Valley Biodiversity Park, which spreads over an area of 69.56 ha on the Southern Ridge, contiguous with the Aravalli ranges of Haryana on 18<sup>th</sup> Feb 23. The park embodies scenic valleys enclosed all around by hills that are further connected with other valleys of the Asola and Bhatti Wildlife Sanctuaries and the Aravallis of Haryana. These valleys receive drainage from all the surrounding hill ranges and the extensive Chattarpur plateau and recharge into the aquifer system of south Delhi. Through this project, they had the opportunity to dig more deeply into this beautiful world, which they were unaware of, and gained knowledge of flora and fauna, birds, small animals, and many other organisms that seem not to be visible normally but are so important for the survival of mankind. They also learned about the threats to these species and how they can help them replenish for just the minimal cost of being responsible people. They get the feeling that many things have been left unexplored in this world, and the project has finally taken them to the point where they can wonder about this world and start exploring it more and more.
