

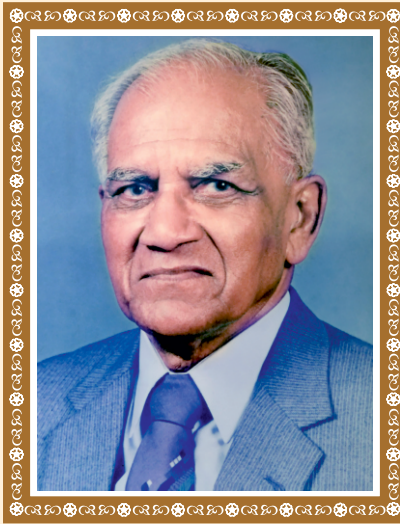

## **SLC IN THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26**

The academic session 2025-26 has been a momentous year for Shyam Lal College (SLC), marked by significant academic accomplishments, infrastructural advancements, and global recognition. Throughout the year, the SLC community comprising faculty, students, and non-teaching staff demonstrated exceptional dedication in fostering a learner-centric environment that emphasized innovation, inclusivity and continuous engagement.

The College achieved A++ accreditation in its second cycle of NAAC accreditation, and secured the 43<sup>rd</sup> position among the top colleges in India under the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), along with international recognition in the WURI rankings. In line with its academic expansion, SLC has proposed the introduction of new Honours courses in Computer Science, Botany, and Physics, and is actively engaged in implementing the 4<sup>th</sup> year of UGCF under NEP 2020.

Further strengthening its innovation ecosystem, the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) earned a prestigious 3-star rating from the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell. The entrepreneurial spirit of students was also evident through the initiatives undertaken under the aegis of the IIC, with several innovative student-led ventures being supported and showcased during the academic session. SLC also retained its ISO 9001 certification and continued to be recognized under the Swachhta Action Plan (SAP) by the Ministry of Education.

Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the College actively promoted student research and innovation by organizing a two-day National Summit titled SRINEP 2025, aimed at providing a dynamic platform for students to engage with the ethos of research, innovation, and multidisciplinary learning. Further strengthening its commitment to intellectual enrichment, three students from Shyam Lal College - Prince Singh, Anshika, and Gourav, secured awards in the Bharat BoudhIKS Examination held on 31 January and 01 February 2026.

As part of its contribution to the national vision of Viksit Bharat@2047, the College advanced academic reforms and skill development. The College secured eight major research projects funded by ICSSR, AICTE, and the Ministry of Education across diverse disciplines, including Commerce, Political Science, English, Mathematics, Computer Science, and Hindi. To further promote undergraduate research culture, multidisciplinary research projects were sanctioned through the College's Research and Development Centre, encouraging inquiry, creativity, and innovation. Multiple faculty members obtained patents in areas such as artificial intelligence, software engineering, environmental monitoring, and language technologies. Complementing these efforts, the College recorded over 100 research publications in Scopus, Web of Science, SCI, and UGC-CARE indexed journals, along with numerous authored and edited books and book chapters.

Institutional academic activities remained vibrant throughout the year, marked by the successful hosting of numerous international and national conferences, national workshops, and training programs for students and staff. The College organized various international conferences on themes such as "Understanding India's National Security in the Emerging World Order: Achievements, Opportunities and Aspirations," "From Heritage to Horizon: Indian Languages and Folklores," "Innovative Trends in Mathematics and Intelligent Systems," and "From Amrit Kaal to Viksit Bharat." Additionally, the College hosted a National Conference on "Bharatiya Bhasha Pariwar - संस्कृति से संवाद : Bharatiya Bhasha and Cultural Heritage." The College further broadened its academic engagement through meaningful collaborations with leading institutions such as AICTE, ICSSR, IUAC, DRDO, IHC, ANRF and IIT, thereby strengthening global exposure, interdisciplinary learning, and research exchange.

SLC maintained high academic standards across disciplines and reported a commendable pass percentage, reflecting academic rigour and the faculty's sustained support systems. To further enrich academic engagement and skill development, certificate courses in Machine Learning, Digital and Social Media Marketing, Data Analytics using Excel and Power BI, and Office Automation were offered through the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), an autonomous scientific society under the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. An MoU with the National Institute of Securities Markets (NISM) has also been finalized, and several collaborative courses will be introduced shortly. In addition, the College offers Add-on Courses in foreign languages under the aegis of the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies and the Department of East

Asian Studies, University of Delhi, providing Certificate and Diploma programmes in German, Spanish, Japanese, and French.

As part of a notable sustainability initiative, the stunning tulip blooms highlighted the College's commitment to seasonal biodiversity and sustainable beautification.

Infrastructurally, the campus has witnessed remarkable development, highlighted by the renovation of the multi-utility Knowledge Resource Centre. The Physics Lab and Lecture Theatre were completely renovated, including recasting of the roof. Very soon, the Physics Lecture Theatre will be converted into a fully equipped multi-utility classroom. The college has also taken all necessary steps to construct additional classrooms and Chemistry Lab. Comprehensive repairs and structural strengthening were carried out across major buildings, along with significant upgrades to the power infrastructure, including AMCs for the HT panel, transformer, RMU, and lifts, as well as the installation of a new LT panel. Learning spaces were modernized with new desks, customized tables, glass partitions, and vitrified flooring. Campus amenities were further improved through water coolers, UV purifiers, an extended centre-stage platform, boundary wall repairs, an experimental garden, and green carpeting. The fully air-conditioned digital library continued to support academic needs, and with the campus already Wi-Fi enabled, ongoing maintenance and enhancements ensured a safe, modern, and enabling environment for education and student well-being.

Various institutional Centers- Sarasvati IKS Centre, Centre for Skill Development (CSD), Centre for Industry Interaction (CII), Centre for Holistic Development (CHD), Women Development Centre (WDC), E-Cell, Enactus, Innovation Council, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Ambedkar Study Circle (ASC), and Gandhi Study Circle (GSC) actively organized lectures, outreach initiatives, seminars, and student-focused programs throughout the year, contributing to an intellectually vibrant and socially responsive campus environment. Complementing these initiatives, as part of Vasantotsav 2026 themed 'Bharatiya Cultural Sangam: Sanskriti ke Rang,' the College hosted a grand Bhajan Clubbing event, where thousands of students participated enthusiastically, creating a vibrant confluence of devotion, culture, and youthful energy.

Alongside academic and research excellence, Shyam Lal College continued to foster a vibrant sports culture, with students achieving remarkable success in inter-college and national tournaments. The college received prize money of ₹1,58,000 in hockey and ₹1,31,000 in kabaddi. The hockey team won ten championships across Inter-College and All India tournaments, with three players selected for the Delhi Hockey Team for Senior Nationals and eleven players representing the DU Hockey Team in the Inter-University Hockey Tournament. The Kabaddi team won the Inter-College Championship and finished third in the Delhi Khel Mahakumbh, with three players representing the Junior National Championship and three participating in the DU Kabaddi Team for the Inter-University Championship. For the first time, the Baseball Team became champions in the Inter-College Baseball Championship, with six players selected for the DU Baseball Team to participate in the All India Inter-University

Championship. The College baseball team also secured third position in the Delhi State Baseball Championship. Volleyball teams secured top positions, including first place at the SYNAPSE Volleyball Tournament (MAMC), first at the Tech Media Fest Volleyball Tournament (Bharati Vidyapeeth, Paschim Vihar), and second at Jamia Hamdard. The Kho-Kho team won the SPARDHA Kho-Kho Tournament at Don Bosco Institute of Technology, while the Football team achieved second place in both the SPARDHA 2026 Football Tournament (NDIM Mehrauli) and the IBS Football Tournament (IBS Gurgaon).

SLC has successfully completed all pending CAS promotions under the 2010 and 2018 regulations. During the reporting year, a substantial number of faculty members progressed in their academic careers. A total of 55 faculty members were promoted from Academic Level 10 to Academic Level 11 across various departments, including Mathematics, Chemistry, Commerce, Physics, Hindi, Economics, Political Science and Botany. Additionally, five faculty members advanced from Associate Professor (Academic Level 13A) to Professor (Academic Level 14). These include Prof. Jaya Kakkar (History), Prof. Samrendra Kumar (Hindi), Prof. Subodh Kumar (Mathematics), Prof. Niti Agrawal (Physics), and Prof. Sitaram Kumbhar (Political Science). In the non-teaching category, Mr. Satyaveer was promoted from Lab Attendant to Lab Assistant, and Mr. Anand Singh was promoted from Office Attendant to Junior Assistant.

I take great pleasure in sharing that Mr. Maheshanand Pant ji retired as Senior Assistant after rendering long, dedicated, and exemplary service to the institution. Prof. Neena Shireesh, Department of Political Science, also retired, concluding a distinguished career marked by commitment, integrity, and valuable contributions to the academic community.

We also express our heartfelt condolences on the sad demise of Shri Sohan Lal from the Department of Physics, who served the institution with sincerity and devotion.

As we celebrate these remarkable achievements, which have infused the College with renewed energy and vision, we recognize that they are a testament to the collaborative spirit of the SLC community. ### 1. International Conferences

The conference attracted over a hundred abstract submissions from scholars across India and abroad, out of which ninety high-quality abstracts were selected and published in the conference souvenir. Over three-hundred students participated enthusiastically in the conference, making it a significant academic event in the national capital.

ad Cultural Heritage" on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2026. Prof. Chand Kiran Saluja, Director (Academics), Sanskrit Promotion Foundation, delivered a keynote address on the profound civilizational interpretation of the intrinsic relationship among Bhartiya culture, nature, and language. ➤ *International Conference on "Innovative Trends in Mathematics and Intelligent Systems"*

The Department of Mathematics and IQAC, Shyam Lal College, hosted a two-day interdisciplinary conference sponsored by DRDO and ANRF. The conference was attended by dignitaries like Prof. Tarun Das, Head and Professor, Department of Mathematics, University of Delhi, Dr. Ajay Kumar, Addl. Director and Scientist-F DRDO, Prof. Ashok Kumar, Dr. Srinivas Jangirala, and Dr. Dharmendra Yadav. The conference featured seven invited talks

delivered by eminent speakers from the fields of mathematics, computing, and allied disciplines. A total of 246 research papers were presented in both offline and online modes, reflecting the diverse participation of researchers and academicians. Overall, nearly 300 participants from various institutions actively took part in the ITMIS-2026 contributing to fruitful discussions and knowledge exchange.

➤ *International Conference on "From Amrit Kaal to Viksit Bharat"*

The Department of Commerce and IQAC in academic partnership with Department of Finance and Business Economics, University of Delhi, in collaboration with Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), supported by Central Bank of India organized a two-day International Conference on March 27-28, 2026 on "Amrit Kaal to Viksit Bharat" Proactive governance, Resilient entrepreneurship and geopolitical realignment for "Goldilocks" economy at SLC. It was graced by the presence of luminaries such as Chief Guest Hon'ble Justice Gita Mittal, Prof. Balaram Pani, Dr. Abhishek Ranjan, further sessions tuned in by Prof. Munim Barai (Japan), Prof. Kaisa Sorsa (Finland), Prof. Alessandro Spano (Italy), Sr. Prof. Deepak Tandon, CA Manoj Mishra among others. The second day of the Conference has been addressed by Prof. Himanshu Kumar Chaturvedi, former DRDO scientist, Dr. W. Selvamurthy, Sr. Prof. Amitabh Gupta, Prof. V.K. Kaul, and Ms. Vineeta Singh. The two-day sessions hosted 105 paper presenters (faculty members, research scholars and UG PG students) from 20 different cities of India. The conference was attended by over 253 academicians and scholars.

➤ *One-day Seminar on "Understanding and Doing Research in Social Science"*

The Department of Political Science, IQAC, and Republica, the Political Science Society of SLC organised a one-day enlightening seminar titled "Understanding and Doing Research in Social Sciences" on 12th November 2025. The session was graced by Dr. P. Arun, a distinguished researcher in Surveillance Studies who also served as the resource person for the event. Almost 160 students participated in this seminar. Twenty faculty members from across the department had also joined the session.

➤ *One-day National Seminar on Evolution of Tax Structure in India*

A One-day National Seminar on "Evolution of Tax Structure in India" was organised by the Department of Commerce & IQAC in collaboration with the Board of Studies, ICAI, on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2026. It aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of India's taxation system, tracing its evolution from traditional frameworks to the contemporary GST regime. The chief guests of the event included dignitaries like Mr. Amit Gupta, IRS Officer, Prof. R.P. Tulsian, and Mr. V.K. Kaul. The seminar also included paper presentations by several students.

## **2. NEP Implementation Initiatives**

### *Student Research and Innovation Under NEP National Summit (SRINEP)*

The IQAC, Research and Development Centre (RDC), and the Institution's Innovation Council

(IIC) of SLC organized a two-day National Summit, titled SRINEP 2025 with the aim to provide a dynamic platform for students to engage with the ethos of research, innovation, and multidisciplinary learning. The Summit was organized on 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2025 and 1<sup>st</sup> November 2025 in collaboration with the knowledge partners - DRDO, IUAC, IHC, CIC (DU), DU Research Council, NIELIT, and SEBI. The chief guest for the summit was Prof. Avinash Chandra Pandey, Director of IUAC, New Delhi who delivered an insightful address on "Innovation and Start-ups. Self-Reliance in Modern India". The Keynote address for the summit was delivered by Dr. Chandrasekhar Buddha, CEO of Anuvadini AI and Chief Coordinating Officer AICTE (MoE, Government of India). Other important dignitaries present in the summit included Ms. Swapnali Naik, Scientist D, NIELIT, Prof. Bibudhananda Biswal, Cluster Innovation Centre, DU, Dr. Ajay Kumar, Scientist, DRDO, Dr. Dhananjay Gadre, NSUT, Delhi, Dr. R.K. Kotnala, Scientist of Eminence, CSIR - NPL Delhi & Former Chairman, NABL, Mr. Shobit Jain, founder of Elchemy, and Prof. Asha Ram Tripathi, Head and Dean (Ex), BHU, SEBI Empanelled Securities Market Trainer. Emerging entrepreneurs and business leaders were also present to share their ideas and strategies with the students and faculty members. These included Ankit - founder of Bodhi Water Supply, Kanishka Tyagi - founder of Emo Sense AI, Jatin Bansal - Founder of Rent Circle, and Sourav - Developer of AI Interview Agent. 80 students from multiple colleges and discipline participated in the summit with their innovative ideas and strategies, out of which, 3 received the award under the Best Research category, and 3 received awards under the Best Innovation category.

## **FLAGSHIP PROGRAMMES**

### ➤ **Sarasvati IKS Centre**

SLC established the Sarasvati IKS Centre as a pioneering initiative to promote and integrate IKS into contemporary education. The Centre explores diverse domains such as Ayurveda, philosophy, spirituality, sciences, mathematics, polity, ethics, and governance, encouraging original research and deeper engagement with India's rich intellectual heritage. A flagship event was the two-day National Conference on "Bharatiya Bhasha Pariwar - संस्कृति से संवाद : Bharatiya Bhasha and Cultural Heritage", organised in collaboration with IQAC and Bharatiya Bhasha Samiti, Ministry of Education, Government of India. Through its reading and discussion forum Vimarsh (The Reading Club), the Centre also organised an Inter-College Panel Discussion, an Inter-College Speech Competition in collaboration with Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL), and "Vande Mataram@150 - A Celebration of Patriotism, Heritage & Harmony, as part of the nationwide observance of 150 years of the national song "Vande Mataram". These activities, attended by students, faculty, and dignitaries, reflected the college's sustained efforts in advancing Indian Knowledge Systems and fostering cultural rootedness. As part of the Centre's flagship initiatives promoting intellectual engagement, three students from Shyam Lal College - Prince Singh, Anshika, and Gourav secured awards in the Bharat BoudhIKS Exam held on 31 January and 01 February 2026.

### ➤ **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan**

Shyam Lal College is actively participating in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a flagship

initiative of the Ministry of Education, aimed at fostering rural development through institutional collaboration. The college has adopted five villages - Dhitora, Nithora, Chirodi, Jawli, and Kotwalpur. UBA has conducted comprehensive surveys to assess local needs, and community outreach programs have been organized in these villages by student volunteers.

➤ **University Chef and Skill India**

SLC takes pride in being the torchbearer of a unique initiative called the 'University Chef' program, aligned with the Government's Skill India initiative. The pioneering endeavour aims to foster creativity and precise thinking among students. Conceived by the Principal, Prof. Rabi Narayan Kar, the inter-college event encourages participants with all necessary support. It brings together passionate participants from various universities to compete in culinary challenges, showcasing and honing their cooking skills for the coveted title of the best chef. The 9th edition of the event was organized in the Shyam Lal College premises on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2026. The event was graced by the presence of the jury members which included dignitaries like Mr. Mukesh Kumar, Executive Chef, Rashtrapati Bhavan; Mr. Amit Gothwal, Executive Chef, Ashoka Hotel, Delhi; Ms. Veeta Singh, Director Pratham Hospitality Services and ex-DGM, The Ashok, New Delhi; Dr. Chef Balendra Singh from IBCA, and Chef Jatin Khurana, MasterChef India, Season 5. The prizes were presented by Pratham Hospitality. Winners received cash prizes as well as various gift hampers.

➤ **Yuvaspandana**

On 1<sup>st</sup> April 2026, the Centre for Skill Development in collaboration with the Entrepreneurship Cell organized its flagship annual event, "Yuvaspandana'26 - The National Skill Development and Startup Fair". Over 100 students from institutions across India participated, showcasing creativity, innovation, and entrepreneurial spirit. The event's highlight was the Skill Expo, where participants presented startup ideas aligned with the theme "Sustainable and Viksit Bharat." The exhibition featured diverse stalls offering jute products, bags, earrings, candles, books, wooden articles, and eco-friendly paintings, reflecting sustainable business practices. Another attraction was the stalls put up by the college's foreign language students, demonstrating French, German, Spanish, and Japanese, languages offered by college. Competitions such as the treasure hunt "Solve Explore" and "Mystery Bid Arena" tested analytical thinking, teamwork, and strategic skills, fostering healthy competition. Startup CDF Satyawati won first place, followed by Kalanot Creation from Shyam Lal College in second, and Wick and Wish from College of Arts in third.

➤ **Institution's Innovation Council**

SLC established Innovation Council (IC) under MoE's Innovation Cell, an initiative launched in November of 2018. The primary mandate of Innovation Cell, MoE is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas. SLC's Innovation Council works towards inculcating the spirit of innovation among students, and develop a start-up

ecosystem. IIC has been awarded a prestigious 3-star rating by AICTE. On 9<sup>th</sup> September 2025, the IIC organized a session on 'Idea Generation for Startups' at the college campus with the objective to promote creativity, innovation, and entrepreneurial thinking among students. A bootcamp on problem solving and ideation was also organized by the council with the aim to encourage team work, leadership, and an entrepreneurial mindset among the students. These varied activities conducted by the council are a testimony to its commitment to the budding entrepreneurs and NEP 2020 implementation.

#### ➤ **Research and Development Centre**

SLC has established a Research and Development Centre (RDC) with the mandate to promote high-quality research aligned with NEP 2020 and the national vision of Atma-Nirbhar Bharat. The RDC works to create a conducive ecosystem for impactful and sustained research by encouraging multidisciplinary projects, organizing skill-enhancement workshops, fostering collaborations with industry, government, and academic institutions, and facilitating access to resources and funding. During the year, the RDC sanctioned one new research project and successfully completed four multidisciplinary projects allotted in the previous cycle. The Centre, jointly with IQAC and IIC, organized a Two-Day National Summit- SRINEP 2025-from 31 October to 1 November 2025, in collaboration with DRDO, IUAC (Delhi), IHC, CIC (DU), the Research Council (DU), NIELIT, and SEBI. Eighty students from institutions across the country participated, presenting innovative ideas in research and entrepreneurship. Under its SHODH-VARTA lecture series, the RDC also hosted a talk on intellectual property rights on 11 September 2025.

#### ➤ **Standards Club (BIS)**

The Standard Club of SLC, in collaboration with the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), observed World Consumer Rights Day 2026 through an Orientation Programme on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2026. The session aimed to enhance awareness of consumer rights, quality assurance, and standardization. Mr. Aditya Raj from the BIS Delhi Branch Office-II delivered an insightful presentation on the role of BIS, the standardization process, conformity assessment, hallmarking, and consumer protection mechanisms. He highlighted how certification marks safeguard public interest and support informed consumer choices. The interactive discussion that followed deepened students' understanding of product quality, safety, and responsible consumer behaviour.

## **BEST PRACTICES**

### **1. SAP (Swachhta Action Plan)**

Under the guidance of the Ministry of Education (MoE), SLC achieved a major milestone in 2020 by being recognized as a Swachhta Action Plan (SAP) institution. As part of this initiative, SLC is actively engaged in key swachhta efforts, including sanitation and hygiene, waste

management, water and energy conservation, and promoting greenery. To ensure the successful implementation of these objectives, the College has formed dedicated committees responsible for developing strategic plans that advance these goals for the benefit of the institution and its stakeholders.

## **2. Adoption of Villages**

SLC actively participates in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) and has taken on the responsibility of supporting the development of five villages in Uttar Pradesh: Dhitora (Baghpat), Nithora, Chirodi, Jawli, and Kotwalpur (all in Ghaziabad). As part of this initiative, the UBA team has conducted detailed surveys and engaged in meaningful dialogue with villagers, village Pradhans, panchayat samities, and other key stakeholders. These interactions, combined with extensive data collection and village visits, have helped identify critical areas for intervention. Building on this foundation, the SLC team has designed and implemented awareness campaigns focused on financial literacy, computer training, government financial schemes, insurance plans, and health coverage. Additionally, workshops have been held to promote sanitation, water conservation, waste management, and the reduction of polythene usage. Practical measures, such as distributing cloth bags, have also been introduced to encourage sustainable waste management practices within these communities.

## **3. Powered by Renewable Energy**

The College's solar power plant is currently operating at full capacity, meeting 50% of our peak energy demand. This achievement stems from a collaboration with IPGCL, Government of NCT of Delhi, which fully funded the installation of the solar panels. Since becoming fully operational, the plant has contributed significantly to reductions in both power consumption and financial expenditure. In addition, the College actively promotes energy conservation through regular initiatives such as switch-off drives.

## **4. East Delhi Flower Show**

Shyam Lal College hosted its flagship event "Umang-East Delhi Flower Show 8.0" on 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, on its campus with the theme "Blossom and Visual Narration of Tradition: Viksit Bharat @ 2047". The event featured an array of inter-college competitions, expertly blending aesthetics with sustainability, event. Nine stalls showcased a vibrant display of traditional culture, and eco-friendly products. The event witnessed an impressive footfall, with enthusiastic students, faculty members, and local residents attending to appreciate the beauty of the flower show. The overwhelming participation of 100 students reinforced SLC's commitment to sustainability and its efforts to create an environmentally conscious community.

## 5. Skill Based Course

The Centre for Skill Development at Shyam Lal College continues to play a vital role in equipping students with industry-relevant skills through innovative and career-oriented programs. A key highlight is the collaboration with the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), an autonomous scientific society under the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Under this strategic MoU, the College offers a robust suite of technology-focused courses, which include:

- Certificate Course in Digital and Social Media Marketing
- Certificate Course in Office Automation
- Certificate Course in Machine Learning
- Certificate Course in Data Analytics using Excel and Power BI

These programs are designed to empower students with emerging digital competencies, preparing them for the evolving demands of the knowledge economy.

Alongside its technological offerings, the College has been successfully running Add-on Certificate and Diploma courses in foreign languages since 2018, under the aegis of the Department of Germanic and Romanic Studies, and the Department of East Asian Studies, University of Delhi. These include:

- Certificate Course in German / Japanese / French
- Diploma in German / Spanish

These diverse and dynamic programs reflect SLC's commitment to holistic, skill-based education aligned with the national initiatives such as Skill India and Digital India.

## 6. Green Initiatives

Environmental conservation has long been the central focus at SLC and the college is now widely recognized for its green ambience and vibrant floral displays. Students and faculty members work collaboratively to cultivate, maintain, and enhance the college's eco-friendly environment.

Key initiatives include:

- Green and Open-Air Pathshala, promoting learning in a natural and eco-friendly setting.
- Stunning tulip blooms that promoted seasonal biodiversity and sustainable beautification.
- Experiential learning activities, where students engaged in sustainable cultivation practices in the College's Experimental Garden.

- Birdhouse installation project, a crucial step toward creating a more sustainable and biodiverse campus environment.
- A notable increase in floral biodiversity on campus.
- A lush campus featuring four curated lawns, one garden, two lush green grounds, two nurseries, one polyhouse, three herbal gardens, two rose gardens, one cactus garden, one kitchen garden, over 700 trees, and a dedicated student activity area for learning and hands-on gardening activities.
- Regular plantation and maintenance drives, both within the campus and in surrounding areas.
- A tobacco-free and smoke-free campus, with a firm stance against the use of crackers and plastic bags.
- Regular tree plantation drives aimed at improving air quality and promote environmental awareness.
- On-site compost pits for recycling garden waste, supporting organic gardening practices.
- Encouragement of battery-powered vehicles and energy-saving behaviour among the campus community.
- Strict prohibition on burning garden waste to reduce air pollution.
- E-waste is managed in accordance with official guidelines, with authorized recyclers ensuring environmentally responsible disposal.
- Installation of filtered water coolers across the campus to ensure access to clean drinking water.
- Development of pedestrian-friendly pathways to reduce vehicular movement.
- Installation of a solar power plant that meets 50% of the College's peak energy demands, promoting renewable energy usage.
- Ongoing efforts toward carbon neutrality through extensive green spaces and tree cover.
- Three LED screens have been installed to display notices and announcements, significantly reducing paper usage.
- The entire campus lighting system has been upgraded to energy-efficient LED lights.
- The Garden Committee promotes the use of in-house compost and natural materials for plant growth and landscaping.
- A fully operational Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) with a capacity of 75,000 litres has been installed; treated water is reused for gardening and landscaping, and additional manure is produced for campus gardens.

Through these sustained efforts, SLC continues to champion a greener, cleaner, and more sustainable future.

## **7. Rain Water Harvesting**

Shyam Lal College remains committed to sustainable water management through the implementation of three rainwater harvesting systems strategically integrated across the campus. By capturing and recharging rainwater from rooftops and open spaces, these systems significantly contribute to groundwater replenishment and reflect the institution's dedication to environmental stewardship.

## **8. Recycling Papers**

SLC remains deeply committed to the conservation of natural resources and actively fosters a culture of respect for the environment. In collaboration with the NGO Jaagruti, the college has been engaged in recycling waste paper, receiving numerous reams of recycled paper throughout the year in return for its efforts.

## **9. Assessment and Feedback**

The College has successfully established a structured feedback system designed to address students' concerns in a timely and efficient manner. The institution regularly collects detailed feedback from students on academic performance, infrastructure, and facilities, and takes appropriate action to resolve identified issues. Furthermore, the IQAC routinely gathers curriculum-related feedback from a wide range of stakeholders. Based on this feedback, an action report is prepared and reviewed with the relevant departments to ensure continuous improvement.

## **10. Counselling Services**

The Head of the institution maintains regular communication with students, both through virtual and in-person platforms, to address any concerns related to uncertainties during the academic session. Professional counselling services provided by qualified counsellors and doctors, are readily available to support students dealing with anxiety and other challenges. The Women and Development Centre (WDC) organize regular counselling sessions to further assist students. Upholding an open-door policy, the principal remains accessible to students during office hours. In addition, a robust mentoring system ensures that faculty members frequently meet with their mentees to address both academic and personal concerns.

## **11. Opportunities for Under-Privileged Children in the vicinity**

SLC is dedicated to promoting sports and games in the trans-Yamuna region of Delhi by providing state-of-the-art coaching facilities and opportunities for young, talented athletes. The College aims to create a cutting-edge platform where individuals can hone their skills, receive expert training, and progress to excel at both national and international levels. As part

of a new initiative, SLC offers free, regular coaching to deserving students from nearby schools, with a focus on promoting indigenous games and increasing awareness of the varied career opportunities within India's sporting landscape. Apart from this, several sensitization programmes like mental health awareness camp, menstruation hygiene awareness camp, environmental awareness drives are being regularly conducted by the NSS/WDC/CSD/Eco-Club unit of the college in these under-developed areas.

## 12. Digital Practices

The College has fully embraced digital practices across all administrative and student-related functions. In collaboration with various departments, the IQAC organizes virtual lectures, talks, and interviews with eminent personalities from around the world. Additionally, the College encourages faculty members to record their lectures using the Screencast-O-Matic v2.0 software, ensuring that students have access to these resources for future reference and learning.

Taking digitalization a step further, the College has integrated students' ID cards into Single Sign-On (SSO) cards, which serve multiple functions:

- **Library Access:** Students can use their SSO cards to issue books, eliminating the need for a separate library card.
- **Security:** The SSO card enhances security by streamlining entry during special events such as student elections, college fests, and annual functions, ensuring smooth and secure campus operations.
- **Bill Payments:** The College is exploring the development of a digital wallet linked to students' accounts, allowing for seamless payment of various campus bills and improving the overall student experience.

The administration stays digitally connected with the non-teaching staff throughout office hours. Routine tasks are assigned and monitored through a shared Google worksheet, ensuring effective communication and task management. For teaching staff, a real-time LED display in the staff room keeps them updated with the latest timetables and important notices.

## 13. Inclusive Education and Development

The practice of Inclusive Education and Development continues to be a cornerstone of the College's efforts for student welfare. Situated strategically, the college provides students from NCR, North-East Delhi, and surrounding areas with invaluable access to a premier institution of Delhi University. Furthermore, every year, students from Jammu and Kashmir have been admitted under PMSSS Scheme. In alignment with the college's vision, it offers value-based education while also ensuring students are equipped with the professionalism needed for success in the industry and competitive job market. Remedial classes, department-specific

workshops, the Placement Cell, and the Skill Development Cell, along with industry interactions facilitated by CII, provides students with substantial exposure to the professional world, preparing them for future challenges.

#### **14. Community Outreach Programme**

SLC is acutely sensitive to its institutional social responsibility and promotes institution neighbourhood-community initiative and outreach programs through its various activities that broadly fall under NCC/NSS/WDC. SLC is surrounded by many underdeveloped, overpopulated and minority community localities, and so becomes the sole facilitator in the area of achieving academic excellence for students belonging to economically backward classes and minority communities. The following are the community outreach steps that the college facilitates:

- The College has NCC, NSS, Woman Development Centre, Research & Development Cell, Centre for Holistic Development, Centre for Industry Interaction and Skill Development, Ambedkar Study Circle, Gandhi Study Circle etc, which organizes events dedicated towards community service like blood donation camp, tree plantation drive, gender sensitization, identity disclosure, more education etc. to enhance the sense of community feeling and citizenship among the students.
- SLC has also adopted Shahdara mandi and regularly conducts cleanliness drives, switch over to cashless trading and plastic free campaigns.
- The College promotes sports and games in the trans-Yamuna region of Delhi by providing opportunities and best coaching facilities to the young and talented players from low-income groups or underprivileged sections of society.
- The College has conducted various surveys in the past, including the survey as part of the project 'Old Age Homes in Delhi - Understanding the Challenges Faced by them and their Contribution to the Society'. The primary objective of this project is to have a closer view at the old age homes functioning in Delhi in order to assess the problems and challenges that these institutions are facing.
- NSS volunteers of the College visit slum areas and spread awareness about cleanliness in collaboration with NGOs and distribute cloth during winter. The tree plantation activities organized by the College are aimed at improving the air quality in and around the College, as well as for creating awareness about protection of the environment.
- WDC regularly organizes activities to sensitize the students and staff to gender related issues and to promote respect for human beings irrespective of race, religion, colour or gender.

- WDC and Mental Health and Wellness Committee (MHWCC), in collaboration with the Institute Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences (IHBAS) organized a lecture on "Depression Among Young Individuals: Early Identification and Management Strategies".
- The College participates in all national initiatives aimed at promoting good citizenship such as cleanliness drive, skill and entrepreneurship development initiatives, "Make in India" campaign, etc.
- SLC has adopted 5 villages under the UBA project under MoE, GoI.
- The NSS Unit organized the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign where NSS volunteers promoted patriotism by encouraging households to hoist the national flag.
- A 'Plantation and Cleanliness Drive' was conducted by the NSS unit. Saplings were planted and cleanliness activities were undertaken to promote environmental sustainability and civic responsibility.
- A Cleanliness Drive to spread awareness about hygiene, sanitation, and the importance of maintaining clean surroundings was organized by the NSS unit.
- NSS unit organized a 'Hypertension Awareness Camp' to promote awareness related to health.
- A 'Menstruation and Personal Hygiene Drive' was organized by NSS where volunteers conducted awareness sessions and distributed essential hygiene products.
- NSS organized the 'Nasha Mukti Campaign' which involved spreading awareness about the harmful effects of substance abuse and encouraging a disciplined lifestyle.
- NSS volunteers visited an Old Age Home, interacting with elderly residents and providing emotional support through meaningful activities.
- The College also provides fee concession, financial aid, book aid, awards and prizes to students from underprivileged sections of society.

## **INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

- Renovated the Multiutility Knowledge Resource Centre.
- Renovated the Physics Lab and Lecture Theatre, including recasting the roof.
- Preparation underway for converting the Physics Lecture Theatre into a fully equipped multi-utility classroom.
- Initiated construction of additional classrooms and a Chemistry Lab.

- Extended the platform near the Centre stage to support various institutional activities.
- Upgraded the electrical system by replacing parts of the transformer and RMU.
- Undertook general building repair work across the campus.
- Installed and fixed students' desks in classrooms to enhance learning spaces.
- Installed two Celfrost water coolers and five UV water purifiers to improve drinking water facilities.
- Supplied, installed, tested, and commissioned the LT Panel and DBs.
- Completed AMC for two lifts, the HT Panel, and the transformer to ensure safe and uninterrupted operations.
- Repaired the boundary wall to strengthen campus safety and security.
- Provided study and computer tables in hall areas and the computer faculty room.
- Installed toughened glass partitions in the garden area.
- Completed repair and renovation work, including structural repairs of college buildings.
- Renovated the toilet near the Centre stage.
- Completed green grass carpeting on the college grounds.

## **UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RESULTS & SCHOLARSHIP**

Once again this year, our students have performed exceptionally well, with the highest number securing first divisions in the examinations. Out of the 3,461 students who appeared in the semester examinations conducted during 2024-25, 3,302 passed, giving an overall pass percentage of 95.41%. An important aspect worth highlighting is the performance across all three years: in the 1<sup>st</sup> year, 1,226 of the 1,349 students passed, recording a success rate of 90.88%; in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, 1,090 of the 1,124 students passed, achieving a 96.97% success rate; and in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year, 973 of the 975 students passed, reflecting an impressive 99.79% success rate.
