In the face of global warming and imminent climate change, it is perhaps time to step up our efforts to save the last green corners of the earth. Due to urbanisation, especially in metropolitan cities, the trees around us have fallen. Perhaps none of us has an accurate answer to questions like 'How much of the green cover have we lost in the past decade?' 'How many trees were cut in the last year in a city like Delhi, and what are the effects on the ecology?' To monitor the trees and their impact on the surroundings, Eco-club and SAP volunteers carried out a week-long campaign (12th-17th Feb '23) called Nature's Drive. They focused on the identification of native and exotic species. The campaign registered a total of 1,000 trees inside and outside the campus, with 60 students participating, resulting in the identification of almost 586 trees. One such opportunity for students to track nearby trees and form connections with them, while also protecting and preserving nature, is the Neighbourhood Tree Campaign' (NTC). The purpose of the entire project was to educate the students about the plants and trees nearby.
