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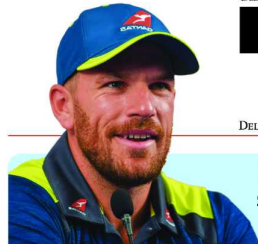

Noida Authority to cancel allotment of plots vacant for over 12 yrs

Noida
There is panic among residential plot owners in Noida as the Noida Authority has decided that the allotments of those allottees who have not constructed on their plots even after more than 12 years would be cancelled.

The Noida Authority has made it clear that the allottees whose construction work is ongoing will have to get the completion certificate within the next six months. If the deadline is not met, such plots in Noida will also be cancelled.

Earlier, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath had ordered the cancellation of allotments of vacant industrial plots in the state. He stated that if the construction had not been done even after allotments of plots three years ago, such allotment should be cancelled.

Following this, Noida, Greater Noida, and Yamuna Authorities are now preparing their respective regional lists in this regard. Hundreds of residential plots in the city's older sectors have been lying vacant for years. Many were allotted more than 12 years ago, but construction hasn't begun. The authority has now ordered a list of all such plots. No extensions will be granted; instead, the allotments will be cancelled.

'Ranathon' held in Noida

A 'Ranathon' was held here on Sunday with an objective to encourage people to move forward together so that every child could progress.

The programme was organised by the Apeejay Vidyalaya and it began with Zumba exercises. Guinness record-holding marathon runner Madan Godara attended this event as the chief guest. He ran in a dhoti, kurta, and slippers, conveying the message of presenting Indian culture on the global stage.

Principal Dr. Neha Sharma described it as a social movement that integrates education, health, inclusiveness, and cooperation. A total of 1,400 participants took part in the race. Races were held in 3, 5, 10, and 16 km categories. Cultural programmes, street plays, and band performances enlivened the event.

The winners were honoured with medals. In the 5 km men's category, Aravind stood first, Atul second and Harsh third, in the 10 km women's category, Geeta stood first, Shalini second and Shalet third. In the 16 km men's category, Dhyanaj, Ayush, Aamir stood first, second and third and in the 16 km women's category, Sona Yadav, Hemlata, Meenakshi stood first, second and third. All of them were from the Parvada-Pardad Education Society, Bulandshahr. Health services were also provided by the Indo Gulf organization.

Delhi Cong launches nationwide signature drive against 'Vote Theft'

The Delhi Congress, under the leadership of President Devender Yadav, has launched a signature campaign protesting what it describes as "vote theft" by the BJP, allegedly in collusion with the Election Commission. The campaign, which began in Babarpur District, has drawn significant participation from a wide spectrum of the public, including youth, shopkeepers, street vendors, and laborers.

Ahead of Diwali 1 700 kg firecrackers seized in multiple raids in Delhi

Delhi Police seized over 1,700 kg of banned firecrackers and arrested seven men in multiple operations across the national capital ahead of Diwali this month, an official said on Sunday.

The crackdown conducted by the crime branch of the Delhi police in Dwarka, Rohini, Uttam Nagar, Shastri Nagar, Mukundpur and Shahdara, Deputy Commissioner of Police Pankaj Kumar said.

The operations were carried out in line with the recent Supreme Court's directions to curb the storage and sale of firecrackers to tackle air pollution and ensure public safety, he said. Delhi's air quality worsens from October onwards and last all through the winter.

The DCP said six men were arrested in the raids and 1,645 kg of fireworks and a pickup truck were impounded.

Another raid was carried



out in northeast Delhi's Mandoli, where 106 kg of banned firecrackers were recovered from a grocery shop owner.

In the first operation, a team unearthed a stockpile of over 916 kg of banned fireworks during coordinated raids in Dwarka, Rohini and Uttam Nagar, he said.

"Acting on a tip-off, a team arrested Akash Gupta

(24), a grocery shop owner, after 13 cartons and a sack of assorted banned fireworks were recovered from his house," the DCP said.

During interrogation, Gupta allegedly revealed that he had procured the fireworks from a pickup driver, Chander Kant (36), who was later caught in Rohini with another 400 kg of illegal firecrackers in his vehicle.

Based on Chander Kant's disclosure, police raided the house of another man, Rishi Raj (37), in Uttam Nagar, recovering an additional 182 kg of banned fireworks, the officer said.

In another operation, a team arrested Rahul Sagar (34), a resident of Shastri Nagar, and seized 412 kg of illegal firecrackers from his residence.

Police said Sagar has four

previous criminal cases, including those related to attempt to culpable homicide, hurt and violation of the Delhi Excise Act, he said.

Another raid was carried out in Mukundpur, Bhaswa Dairy area where Sonu (30) was arrested and 311 kg of banned firecrackers concealed in a residential building disguised as an LED bulb manufacturing unit was recovered, the officer said.

A team also caught Vishal Sharma (34) selling banned fireworks in the Ashok Nagar Market of Shahdara and recovered 106 kg of illegal stock from his possession.

Delhi Police also seized 10 kg of illegal firecrackers from a grocery shop and arrested a man in northeast Delhi's Mandoli. Acting on a tip-off, a team conducted a raid at B-Block, Main Mandoli Road.

Police said the accused admitted his involvement during interrogation and a case has been registered at Jyoti Nagar police station.

Special cell arrests key logistic provider of Nandu Gang

The Special Cell of the Delhi Police has arrested a key associate of the Kapil Sangwan, alias Nandu gang, in a major breakthrough against organized crime. The accused, identified as Harish Saini, also known by his aliases Hitesh and Lucky, was apprehended from Nihal Vihar following a police raid led by ACP Neeraj Kumar.

According to the police, the arrest has shed light on a murder case in Badli, Hajaraj (Haryana), where a man named Sandeep was shot dead on July 17, 2025. Investigators revealed that Saini, 35, was a key logistic provider who arranged vehicles, safe houses, and other support for the shooters on the instructions of gang leader Kapil Sangwan.

During the arrest, the police recovered a single-shot pistol and two live cartridges from Saini's possession. The operation was carried out after the Special Cell received a tip-off about his whereabouts. When the police team reached the spot, Saini allegedly tried to flee and even pulled out a firearm. However, officers overpowered him and made the arrest without any injury.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Aalap

Patel confirmed that an additional FIR has been registered against Saini in connection with his attempt to escape and the illegal possession of arms. The DCP further stated that Saini had been instructed directly by Kapil Sangwan, who is currently operating his gang from abroad.

"Saini has a criminal background and has previously been involved in three serious cases, including robbery and violations of the Arms Act in Delhi," said DCP Patel. "He played a crucial role in facilitating gang operations by providing logistical and ground support."

Police sources said that Saini's personal history paints a picture of hardship and decline. After his father's death, his mother worked as a maid to support the family. His elder brother is serving a jail term for murder, and Saini reportedly drifted into the world of crime under the influence of the Nandu gang during that period.

The Special Cell continues to investigate the larger network of associates linked to the Nandu gang. Officials said that Saini's arrest could lead to further breakthroughs in identifying safe houses, financiers, and other members involved in the gang's interstate operations.

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Yadav asserted that the BJP regained power by undermining the people's vote, calling the alleged practice a direct attack on democracy.

He cited Rahul Gandhi's recent exposé on the matter as a catalyst for public awareness, noting that it has spurred widespread inter-

Pankaj Singh flags off Aakash Healthcare's 10 free ambulances across Delhi-NCR

During the event, Dr. Singh praised public-private partnerships in health care, stating that collaboration between government and private hospitals transforms healthcare delivery. He encouraged further improvements in the emergency response system, emphasizing that the ambulance service is completely free for the public, ensuring accessibility for everyone.

Delhi Police arrests man from Haryana's Nuh for sextortion

The Delhi Police has arrested a 26-year-old man from Haryana for allegedly running a sextortion racket, an officer said on Sunday.

The accused allegedly forced a person to transfer to him Rs 39,000 by threatening to upload a video of him online.

According to police, on June 5, the complainant received a video call from an unknown woman. The call was immediately disconnected.

Shortly after, the victim received a call from a mobile number where the caller, posing as a cyber police officer, said that an explicit video of him would be uploaded to social media. "Deputy Commissioner of Police (Outreach) Hareeshwar Swami said,

The officer said the caller then connected him to another person, who claimed to be an employee of a social media platform, and demanded money for removing the video.

"Out of fear, the victim transferred Rs 39,000 in three transactions to a UPI ID, realising only later that he had been cheated. He then filed a complaint on the National Cyber Reporting Platform (NCRP)," Swami said.

Police investigated the call and bank account details and raided a premise in the Mubarkpur village in Haryana's Nuh, arresting one Mohammad Naseem, the officer said.
