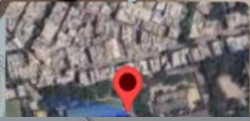
DEBATE SESSION

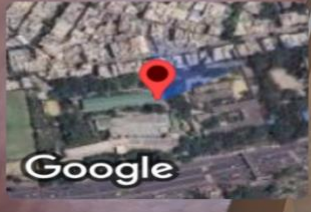
