There is a barrage at Wazirabad which supplies drinking water to the city of Delhi. Yamuna River also has its own historical and well as cultural values. Yamuna River plays a significant role in the field of spiritualism. Various Ghats at the Yamuna River are the holy pilgrimage site for worship. Thousands of people visit Ghats of Yamuna River for the Yamuna Aarti on regular basis.

About The Yamuna Mahotsav

As a maiden attempt to pay homage to the life line of our city, the Yamuna River, Shyam Lal College, University of Delhi conducted the Yamuna Mahotsav on 5th and 6th of March, 2021 at College Campus as well as Yamuna Ghat. The theme of the Festival was "Conservation and Rejuvenation of the Ever Green Yamuna". It aims to spread more awareness towards conservation and rejuvenation of Yamuna River among the students and society at large.

Under the able leadership of our respected Principal Sir, Professor Dr. Rabi Narayan Kar, the festival was organized by the Fine Arts Society, NSS and Eco Club in collaboration with IQAC. A Plantation and Cleanliness drive, along with a Pledge to conserve the river was held at the Ghat of Yamuna followed by an Eco-friendly Aarti by lighting more than 1000 lamp. Both online and offline events like Nukkad Natak, Dance Performances, Stage Play, Musical Compositions and live Band, Debate, Film Making, Photography and Fine Arts Exhibition was organized as a part of Festival.

The online events held during the festival were Orator's bout by the college debating society Sheershadth, a short film making competition by Falcon Film society, a poetry competition by Qasida poetry society and a photography competition by the fine arts society of the college. The

offline events held during the festival were a Nukkad Natak on the theme of Yamuna river conservation by Aakrosh street play society. NSS with Eco club conducted a Plantation and Cleanliness drive, along with a Pledge to conserve the river was held at the Ghat of Yamuna followed by an Eco-friendly Aarti. Aarodhya dance society displayed dance performances on the rich cultural heritage of India and its rivers.

A Stage play was put up by the college dramatics society, Jharokha. The Swaragam music society and the live band of the college, Insignia added glory to the festival by their soulful musical renditions. An art exhibition by Eco club and fine arts society along with live canvas painting added beauty to the festival. 250 participants attended the event.

DAY - 1: 5th MARCH, 2021

On the first day of the event AAKROSH got the opportunity to perform its play "SHURUWAT KHUD SE" which highlighted the main causes of the rising pollution level in the river Yamuna. The play emphasis on the retrospective comparison of river Yamuna to the Thames which was 50 years ago declared biologically dead while Yamuna was considered amongst the cleanest ones. Presently the latter is considered the cleanest river in the world however Yamuna is one of the most polluted rivers in the country. Aakrosh has sought to take an initiative in order to sensitise people and spread awareness regarding the rising pollution levels of River Yamuna.














Yamuna Aarti

The final screening was conducted on the 6 March 2021on the campus. Falcon Films put in a






QASIDA - The Poetry Society of Shyam Lal College




SHEERSHASTH - The Debating Society of SLC


DAY - 2: 6th MARCH, 2021


